From the Parochial Vicar

As far as I am concerned, a "must see" in Rome is the Villa Borghese and its fabulous art collection, especially its magnificent sculpture collection. One of those pieces is portrayed on the cover of this week's bulletin: Gian Lorenzo Bernini's life size "David" sculpted in 1623 and completed in just seven



months in 1624 for Cardinal Scipione Borghese's villa where it remains to this day. Filled with intensity, every detail of this statue is worth absorbing as it tells the story found in the Bible. 1 Samuel 17.

The mighty Philistine army is on the march preparing to invade Israel. Israel's army is led by King Saul and they are preparing their defense against this invasion. At some point a Philistine, Goliath, a giant of a man and a battle seasoned veteran, issues a challenge: let's not have a bloody battle where many lives will be lost. Instead, let's have a one-on-one duel and the winner takes all! The Israelites are terrified and no one comes forward to take Goliath up on his offer. Until, of course, David comes upon the scene.

David is the youngest of eight brothers and he has been sent to the front lines by his father, Jesse, to bring food and provisions to his brothers and to their commanding officers. David hears of Goliath's challenge and presents himself to King Saul to volunteer. At first the King objects because of David's age and his inexperience in battle. But David relates to him his experience as a shepherd and how, in protecting his father's sheep, he had killed a lion once and a bear at another time. With no one else volunteering, King Saul finally accepts David's offer to battle Goliath. Preparing David for the battle, King Saul dresses him in his

tunic, his armor, his helmet and his sword. David, of course, has never worn battle gear and he can hardly walk. Confronting Goliath with all this "stuff" he was not used to wearing would have been the end of David! Removing all this, he goes to the river bed, takes a few smooth stones, gets his shepherd's staff and his sling, prays to God "who delivered me from the claws of the lion and the bear, will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine." He is ready!

David enters the battle not on Goliath's terms, but with trust in God's power and using his own abilities—this was not the first time he used a sling and a stone—he confronts the giant who is both insulted and amused at who is coming against him. The duel is short, it does not last long. David has great maneuverability and freedom while Goliath is rather stationary-waiting for hand-to-hand combat that never comes. With sling and stone, David is victorious over the Philistine.

We all encounter Goliaths in life, someone, something, some situation ready to swallow us up, to do us in, and to tear us down. David is a model for us showing us to rely on our own abilities and on "Him whose power at work in us can do more that we could ask for or even imagine." (Ephesians 4:20)




IC Online Giving

Amoris Laetitia...Pope Francis



Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Love bears all things: In #113: Married couples joined by love speak well of each other; they try to show their spouse's good side, not their weakness and faults. In any event, they keep silent rather than speak ill of

them. This is not merely a way of acting in front of others; it springs from an interior attitude. Far from ingenuously claiming not to see the problems and weaknesses of others, it sees those weaknesses and faults in a wider context. It recognizes that these failings are a part of a bigger picture. We have to realize that all of us are a complex mixture of light and shadows. The other person is much more than the sum of the little things that annoy me. Love does not have to be perfect for us to value it. The other person loves me as best they can, with all their limits, but the fact that love is imperfect does not mean that it is untrue or unreal. It is real, albeit limited and earthly. If I expect too much, the other person will let me know, for he or she can neither play God nor serve all my needs. Love coexists with imperfection. It "bears all things" and can hold its peace before the limitations of the loved one.
