

From the Parochial Vicar

Father Matt Malone, S.J., editor of *America* Magazine, (the previous editor of *America* Magazine was Father Drew Christiansen, S.J. who is well known by many in these parts through his ministry at Saint Ann's, West Newbury) describes in his weekly column, "Of Many Things" (August 15–22, 2016) the painful



ordeal of losing his ability to hear, suffering a sudden and irreversible attack of tinnitus. The doctors what happened as "idiopathic described sudden sensorineural hearing loss," which he says was "a fancy way of saying I went deaf abruptly and no one really knows why." Father Matt's article really resonated with me because I too suffer with hearing loss. Unlike Father Matt, my hearing loss was gradual over many years. I was in my mid-forties when I found it necessary to begin wearing a hearing aid. And although many people have far greater physical challenges than I have, being hard of hearing, I believe, presents its own unique issues. Among these challenges are, where to sit at table, where to sit in a theatre or auditorium, are there background noises, volume controls, talking on the phone, restaurants that are loud with a lot of TVs all on, occasions where everyone is speaking at the same time, etc. etc. When you don't hear something you may ask the person to repeat. No need to shout! For me so often it is not a matter of volume as it is a matter of clarity of sound. "Garbled" and "muffled" I don't do well with. Most are understanding, but occasionally you might get, "Forget about it!" It's happened to me. As Father Matt offers, "If I may, a piece of unsolicited advice: 'Forget about it' is just about the most offensive thing you can say to someone with a hearing loss. If it was important enough to say in the first place, then say it again. It's not our fault that we didn't hear you."

Life presents each of us with challenges and I believe it is the challenges that we are presented with that offer us the opportunities to grow in self-knowledge, in the love and understanding of our brothers and sisters, and ultimately of our love and understanding of God.

One of the works of art that I used in our "Rediscover Catholicism" series earlier this summer (see cover) was a "one of a kind" "nothing like it in the world" masterpiece by

Matthias Grunwald, The Isenheim Altarpiece (1512-1516). Matthias painted this work for the Chapel of the Monastery of Saint Anthony in Isenheim near Colmar, which specialized in hospital work. The Antonine monks of the monastery were noted for their care of plague sufferers as well as their treatment of skin diseases such as ergotism, also known as Saint Anthony's Fire. Saint Anthony's Fire was a disease contracted by the eating of bread contaminated with ergot fungus, causing the sensation of being on fire, hallucinations, constriction of blood vessels, gangrenous extremities, resulting in death. The image Matthias Grunwald painted of the crucified Christ is pitted with plague-type sores and ergot symptoms, showing patients that Jesus understood and shared their afflictions. He is one who shared in all they were suffering.

Whatever our challenges may be, Jesus invites us to "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."




