Ouestions of the Week



Adult: What nourishes your life? What does the phrase "living bread" mean for you?

Child: Why do we eat? What does Jesus mean when He says He is "living bread"?

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

There are few comfort foods that satisfy more than a good, hearty beef stew accompanied by a nice crusty loaf of bread for dipping and soaking up every little bit of juicy goodness. It warms you



up, fills you up, and gives you all the energy you might need to be about whatever task is in front of you. One can imagine that if you were starving, images of bread and stew-filled fleshpots might dance through your mind as your stomach rumbles and aches with the pangs of hunger. Forced to go without, it is enough to cause even the most stoic among us to grumble... at least a little!

With this Old Testament backdrop, St. John unfolds his series of what is often known as the "Bread of Life" discourse. There is no "Institution Narrative" of the Last Supper in John's Gospel as are found in the Synoptic Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In John, we have only these multiple dialogues of Jesus with various people, slowly unpacking John's vision of the Eucharist and how we participate in it. It is important to let it all soak in! Maybe there is a part of us that wants to quickly go for the literal imagery of the Synoptics: "Take this all of you and eat of it, for this is my body..." Jesus says the "magic" words and bread is changed into his body and blood.

But John's approach through his storytelling invites us into a different appreciation of the gift that is the Eucharistic presence of the Lord. What does this bread do, John asks?! It gives life to the world, Jesus answers! It is not about being satisfied (very temporarily) in the here and now, but rather this bread will end any kind of hunger for anything! And the bread is not a "what," an object to be gathered or acquired. It is a "who!" Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (John 6:35)

As John tells it, Jesus was always surrounded by those who were asking the wrong questions or looking for the wrong thing. At first the crowds were seeking physical healing—signs from God. Then, having been fed by Jesus, they were looking for more food, because they were hungry again. Then they wanted to see some more signs from Jesus. Then, when they were starting to catch on that there was something more happening in their midst, they wanted to know what God wanted them to do—what work were they to be about...perhaps so that they could see more signs and get more food. Ughh!

The work that God wanted to accomplish was through

them—to call forth faith in their hearts so that they could believe in the One whom God sent, Jesus Christ. It was internal, not external. The inner conversion of their hearts to Christ would open them to the unlimited power of God to completely heal, fulfill, and satisfy them unto eternal life. Earthly food and drink, no matter how hearty or comforting, would not even be the merest snack compared to the ultimate nourishment that is Jesus Christ.

Now there is a meal!

Just like a well-celebrated Thanksgiving dinner, God wants to nourish and satisfy us on many more levels than simply calming a few physical hunger pangs. The hunger we feel for earthly food is itself a lens for us to understand what God has done for us in Christ. For just as we are nourished at Thanksgiving by more than simply turkey, stuffing, and cranberry sauce...but also by the love of gathered family and friends, by the oft-told stories and memories that are shared around the table, and yes, by the football and parades, too...so God wants to fill us with his love, mercy, compassion, and forgiveness in Christ who is the Bread of Life and the very embodiment of God's selfless love for us all.

Comfort food, indeed!

Let's open our hearts in the weeks to come of the many treasures John will share with us about who Jesus is and how we might experience his love for us in an ever deeper way.



Amoris Laetita...Pope Francis



Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

Accompanying the first years of married life: In # 220: This process occurs in various stages that call for generosity and sacrifice. The first powerful feelings of attraction give way to the realization that the other is now a

part of my life. The pleasure of belonging to one another leads to seeing life as a common project, putting the other's happiness ahead of my own, and realizing with joy that this marriage enriches society. As love matures, it also learns to "negotiate." Far from anything selfish or calculating, such negotiation is an exercise of mutual love, an interplay of give and take, for the good of the family. At each new stage of married life, there is a need to sit down and renegotiate agreements, so that there will be no winners and losers, but rather two winners. In the home, decisions cannot be made unilaterally, since each spouse shares responsibility for the family; yet each home is unique and each marriage will find an arrangement that works best.
