### From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This past month, as I have often done on vacation, I had an opportunity to spend some time on the beach with friends. While enjoying the sand, surf, and beautiful weather, in years past I also have tried my hand at some kite flying. As an



adult, I realized quickly that this entailed a little more skill and equipment than the plastic-and-string variety I had once dabbled with as a kid. Kite flying can be serious business! One could spend hundreds or even thousands to get the right rig aloft. I opted for a more modest approach, but it did entail hundreds of feet of special synthetic string, a proper reel, the actual carbon-fiber-backed kite itself and the all-so-necessary tail for stability. My years of experience also taught me that unless I wanted to just stand there with the reel in hand the entire flight time, a sturdy anchor in the sand was also a must so that I could do other things, like go swimming while admiring my soaring handiwork from a distance.



The beach where I have usually flown my kites in the past has almost always enjoyed a very steady breeze. It is perfect for launching and maintaining a kite many hundreds of feet in the sky. As I unpacked my equipment and rigged it for flight, the air was filled with a constant wind. I set my anchor (the bottom half of a screw-in umbrella stand), attached the 20-foot tail and up it went! I quickly unreeled 50, then 100, then 150 feet of line. my hand burning from the friction. Ahhh! My

kite was glistening in the sun, gently bobbing in the humid air aloft, as beautiful as it ever had been.

All was right with the world.

I secured the reel to the anchor and was just about to set my mind to the water for a swim when disaster struck! No sooner had I turned my back on my handiwork, when, somehow, it detached. And then, in what seemed like a matter of seconds, my kite was a quarter mile out to sea, sputtering from the sky to its inevitable, watery grave. I'm still not sure what exactly what went wrong. Somehow the carabiner (I told you this was serious business!) that was supposed to hold back the reel had let go. I was left standing there like a fool, helpless and dumbstruck. Farewell my fluttering, colorful, nylon friend....

But even in the midst of life's little tragedies (and this certainly was tiny compared to anything else), without warning a little girl from a nearby blanket came over and said, "Mister, I'm sorry about your kite. It was really pretty." And then, all of a sudden, she was gone, back to her own little world of building sand castles and dodging incoming waves. I guess I had seen her and her family when I got down to the beach some time earlier, but hadn't paid her much attention. She was just part of the typical background of any summer beach scene: blankets, umbrellas, towels, sun-bathers, sand castles, people on beach chairs, an

occasional surf-casting fisherman and many dozens of young children at play. What I didn't expect was the depth of her compassion!

Breaking through the ever-rigorous standard of "don't talk to strangers," she so honestly and directly wanted to console me as she empathized, just for the briefest second, with my "loss." She, too, had enjoyed the kite's brief aerial beauty. She must have thought for a moment how she would have felt, had it been her kite that was condemned to an unwelcome burial-at-sea. So, in her humanness, she broke free of social norms and wiggled from the watchful eyes of her parents for the briefest moment to offer her condolences.

I'm still amazed at how genuine her words were. I wonder how many of us are able to be as human to one another in our daily lives? Can we offer the unencumbered compassion that this child showed? Can we empathize with the small and occasionally substantial losses we all suffer

from time to time? Can our words of care and concern really help heal the many insults that life sometimes throws at us? Can we find a way to break through the social norms and awkwardness of expectations to connect in the most innocent and human of ways?



Our Gospel this weekend offers us one of the most beloved parables of all time, the story of the Prodigal Son. In it we see the amazing depth of the father's love that cut across even the deepest chasms of sin and shame and offered the healing balm of forgiveness, not only for the wayward son, but also for the village and community which he abandoned. The closing scene leaves us with that same father pleading with his older son to return and make their home whole once again. We don't know how it ends. It is left unresolved, I think, because this is where we come in. This is where we must find a way to overcome our own pride, our hatred, our narrow mindedness, our self-centered absorption and discover a way to connect, to engage in the amazing love that is offered to us in Christ, who is the perfect expression of the Father.

Maybe we struggle to make that connection from time to time. But I have confidence that this love of God is more robust than the greatest of our failures. If a little girl on a distant beach can embody even the tiniest shred of it, imagine what we can do if we really work at it?

May the love of God embrace us all as we move forward into these fall months.

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will meet on the second Sunday of the month, September 11, 2016, in the Parish Center at 2:00pm and will return to its regular third Sunday of the month on September 18th. For September 11 we will continue reading the second section of *The Book of Isaiah*, The Book of Consolation, Chapters 47 through 51. The Book of Consolation is generally attributed to an anonymous poet who prophesied toward the end of the Babylonian exile and contains the great messianic oracles known as the Suffering Servant songs. Chapter 48 will mark the conclusion of Part 1 of this section: *The Lord's Glory in Israel's Liberation*. Chapters 49 through 55 are entitled: *The Expiation of Sin, Spiritual Liberation of Israel*.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

"He who has a bountiful eye will be blessed, for he shares his bread with the poor" (Pro 22: 9).

#### Feed the Hungry

We must feed the hungry or be damned.... The very core of Christianity is not the focus on self but on the forgetfulness of self and the focus on others. Jesus tells us: "This is how all people will know that you are my disciples, that you love one another" (Jn 13: 25). To feed the hungry is not an option for the Christians. We must take care of others if we hope to get to heaven. What will you do on Judgment Day when you stand before God and he asks you: Why in your lifetime did an average of twenty thousand children in the world die every day because of hunger-related causes? Will you say, "I am not sure, God, but they were not my kids," to which he will respond, "No, they were mine"? The point is that we need to make sure we live what we believe and that we prepare ourselves for the final judgment. We should not do any of this out of fear or quilt, but out of mercy and love! (Beautiful Mercy: Experiencing God's Unconditional Love so we can share it with Others, Dynamic Catholic, pp. 29-30).
