From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

OK. Honest question: How many of you, after hearing this weekend's Gospel about the Dishonest Steward, were left scratching your heads wondering why Jesus was praising this clear breach of duty and downright financial mischief? This "steward" was anything but—he



was self-centered, self-serving and clearly no fan of truth and honesty. Crafty?, yes. To be praised, no! This guy deserved some serious jail time, not compliments. Right?

The cultural differences of Jesus' time and place and our own make our initial read of this parable problematic. But factor this in: Honor was the most important commodity that was traded in ancient times in the Mediterranean. It was more valuable than any amount of olive oil or wheat. And much harder to come by. On a practical level, to gain honor, someone else had to lose some or be shamed.

What this "Dishonest Steward" managed to accomplish was a rare, win-win situation. By secretly writing-off some of the amounts owed to his master, he increased his standing with these debtors. They would have remembered the steward's help in gaining them some relief from the often crushing level of debt that many carried.

But more importantly, the debtors would have thought that the master was behind the whole thing and would have been supremely grateful and complimentary of such generosity. In fact, they would have been so appreciative of what the master had (unknowingly) done, they would have spread the word far and wide about what a wonderful and

Fr. Broderick's Scripture Study

Scripture Study Will Meet on September 18, 2016

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will return to its regular third Sunday of the month on September 18th. We will continue reading the second section of *The Book of Isaiah*, The Book of Consolation, Chapters 47 through 51. The Book of Consolation is generally attributed to an anonymous poet who prophesied toward the end of the Babylonian exile and contains the great messianic oracles known as the Suffering Servant songs. Chapter 48 will mark the conclusion of Part 1 of this section: *The Lord's Glory in Israel's Liberation*. Chapters 49 through 55 are entitled: *The Expiation of Sin, Spiritual Liberation of Israel*.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.

amazing person he was! Everyone would have been talking about his greatness and holding him in high esteem. Which, of course, would have eventually gotten back to the master in the form of other benefits and blessings.

It was a win-win scenario of the first order. Any anger the master would have had for his steward mishandling his estate would have been quickly swept aside by the good will that he generated on his master's behalf among the whole village. Maybe so much so, that the steward might have even kept his job. That's how substantially valued honor was in ancient times.

The lesson, translated for us today, is to do the same to increase God's honor. How do we act, what actions do we take to enable others to give God praise? The greatest thing we can accomplish is to live our lives so well that others can see God's goodness through us and in what we do. Ultimately, it's not about us, it's all about God.

What is one thing that I can do today that will show God's love, mercy, compassion, forgiveness, and glory to someone else?

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. In #47—The Fathers also called particular attention to "families of persons with special needs, where the unexpected challenge of dealing with a disability can upset a family's equilibrium, desires and expectations... Families who lovingly accept the difficult trial of a child with special needs are greatly to be admired. They render the Church and society an invaluable witness of faithfulness to the gift of life. In these situations, the family can discover, together with the Christian community, new approaches, new ways of acting, a different way of understanding and identifying with others, by welcoming and caring for the mystery of the fragility of human life. People with disabilities are a gift for the family and an opportunity to grow in love, mutual aid and unity... If the family, in the light of the faith, accepts the presence of persons with special needs, they will be able to recognize and ensure the quality and value of every human life, with its proper needs, rights and opportunities. This approach will promote care and services on behalf of these disadvantaged persons and will encourage people to draw near to them and provide affection at every stage of life."
