# History of the St. Vincent de Paul Society

Frederic Ozanam, a young university student in Paris in the



early 19th century, was deeply moved at the hopeless state of many families after the cholera epidemic of 1832. These people were homeless, unemployed, starving, and ill. Ozanam felt something must be done, so he and a small group of friends formed the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (named after the patron saint of Christian charity) to help these poor families. With the help of Sr. Rosalie

Rendu, a Daughter of Charity, Ozanam and his companions were introduced to many people in the city who could benefit from their ministry.

Very soon, others in Paris started to notice the good deeds and charitable works of these men and, within a year, the small group of seven had expanded to 100. The group set up different "conferences" and expanded to other areas around Paris. Within 10 years, the Society had expanded to 48 cities in France and Italy and had over 9,000 members. The Society came to America in 1846.

The work of the St. Vincent de Paul Society continues today in many countries throughout the world. Join us on September 29 for the annual "Friends of the Poor" walk to raise funds to continue the good works of Frederic Ozanam and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

### Amoris Laetita...Pope Francis

Pope Francis released the Exhortation on the Family. We continue to review the various statements from the Holy Father.

When death makes us feel its sting 253: At times family life is challenged by the death of a loved one. We cannot fail to offer the light of faith as a support to families going through this experience. To turn our backs on a grieving family would show a lack of mercy, mean the loss of a pastoral opportunity, and close the door to other efforts at evangelization.

258: If we accept death, we can prepare ourselves for it. The way is to grow in our love for those who walk at our side, until that day when "death will be no more, mourning and crying and pain will be no more" (Rev 21:4). We will thus prepare ourselves to meet once more our loved ones who have died. Just as Jesus "gave back to his mother" (cf. Lk 7:15) her son who had died, so it will be with us. Let us not waste energy by dwelling on the distant past. The better we live on this earth, the greater the happiness we will be able to share with our loved ones in heaven. The more we are able to mature and develop in this world, the more gifts will we be able to bring to the heavenly banguet.
