From the Parochial Vicar

Dear Friends,

Last week we gathered for the funeral of Larry Howard, a Newburyport native and a life-long member of Immaculate Conception Parish. Larry was called by many "a true Newburyport icon." It



was my privilege to preside at his funeral Mass which was in so many ways a parish and a community event, with family, friends and many parishioners as well as representatives from city government, the police department, both past and present leadership of the Salvation Army, the Immaculate Conception Parish Choir, and the Immaculate Conception Parish Consolers Circle, which offered the collation after the funeral. Taking my lead from Larry being called an "icon," let me share with you some of the thought I presented in my homily.

I met Larry on the first weekend (June 2015) I was at Immaculate Conception as the Parochial Vicar beginning the collaboration of the two Parishes, Immaculate Conception Parish, Newburyport/Newbury and Holy Redeemer Parish, Merrimac/West Newbury. I usually arrive early to prepare for Mass and Larry was already in the Church. I said "hello" but he was very busy . . . here one minute, over there the next, talking to this person then to another! Talking on his cellphone now, going out of the Church, then coming back in! It seemed he was everywhere. "Who is this?" I asked. I had met the "iconic" Larry Howard.

That word "icon" is often used to refer to someone or something that has long lasting significance, importance, and value. Most especially the word "Icon" refers to religious images. Visit the Church of the Annunciation, the Greek Orthodox Church, on Harris Street and you will see many beautiful Icons, venerated images of the holy and windows to heaven. In our own Catholic tradition, we encounter a woman as we pray the Stations of the Cross. While Jesus carried the Cross to the place of crucifixion, a woman of compassion stepped forward to wipe his dirty, sweaty, blood-stained face and miraculously an image of His holy face was imprinted on her towel. We call this woman Veronica, a name formed from two Latin words: "vero," meaning true, and "ica," for icon or image. A true image!

How was Larry Howard an Icon, a true image of what is good and holy? Let me mention three ways. Larry was loyal, kind, and humble.

Loyal: Larry was loyal to this city, to the Parish and to its people. He knew everybody and knew everything that was going on. He went to wakes and funerals and with heart-felt sorrow would "weep with those who weep." And he went to weddings too. I heard he wept at those too. He sang in the Parish choir and he passed the basket taking up the offertory collection each week. He volunteered for the Salvation Army especially around the holidays, ringing the

bell, and possibly holding the world record of 246 hours of bell ringing in one season. He worked at the Riverside Café for many years as a loyal employee. (We thank the good folks at the Riverside Café for the gift of a Vestment—a chasuble and stole—given in Larry's memory. I wore it at Larry's funeral.)

Kind: Many people relate various acts of kindness that Larry performed; small things perhaps but kind and thoughtful gestures are always appreciated. One neighbor relates how he would shovel snow and help bring in the groceries. He would often have Masses and prayers offered for people.

Humble: I was personally moved by his humility when this past June Larry was asked to speak at the end of the monthly Ultreya (Ultreya, a Spanish word, meaning "onward" is a monthly gathering to which everyone is invited and an opportunity for people who have lived Cursillo to grow in their commitment to Jesus and his Church.) He spoke to us of his diagnosis, his fears as he faced the future and his need for prayer and the support of the community. Larry was born in Newburyport, lived here all his life, graduated from Newburyport High School, never went to college, earned no degrees, never married, has no children, didn't have a high-paying job, was not rich according to the standards of the world, never travelled very far, yet . . .here we are, a Church full of people who came to celebrate the life of this loyal, kind, and humble man.

To Larry's family: to his sisters, Marjorie and Charlene, to his brothers, Thomas and James, and their respective wives, Michelle and Judy, and to all Larry's relatives and friends, we offer our deepest sympathy at his passing. We thank you for making Immaculate Conception Parish "stained glass project" the recipient of memorial gifts in Larry's memory. Thank you very much.

We commend Larry into the keeping of his Lord and Savior and we pray that his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God will rest in peace. Amen.

Scripture Study Will Meet on September 11, 2016
Note change in September schedule

Father Broderick's Scripture Study will meet on the second Sunday of the month, September 11, 2016, in the Parish Center at 2:00pm and will return to its regular third Sunday of the month on September 18th. For September 11 we will continue reading the second section of *The Book of Isaiah*, The Book of Consolation, Chapters 47 through 51. The Book of Consolation is generally attributed to an anonymous poet who prophesied toward the end of the Babylonian exile and contains the great messianic oracles known as the Suffering Servant songs. Chapter 48 will mark the conclusion of Part 1 of this section: *The Lord's Glory in Israel's Liberation*. Chapters 49 through 55 are entitled: *The Expiation of Sin, Spiritual Liberation of Israel*.

Our beloved teacher, Father Broderick, not only explains the meaning of the Scripture passages, but also presents rich description of the period and places cited, as well as the culture and practices of the people involved. He connects the events in the New Testament to Old Testament prophecies and events, as well as to our own time. This is a worthwhile way to spend an hour and fifteen minutes on a Sunday afternoon. All are invited to attend these sessions and grow in knowledge and faith.
