A Word from Fr. Courtright

How do we 'Love one another'?

If we love one another as Christ loved us, we know we are called to sacrifice ourselves and to serve. In today's Gospel we hear Jesus declare the new commandment: "As <u>I</u> have loved you, so you also should love one another." I am often amazed and find great joy in the diversity of people from all over the world who come together each week in unified prayer here at St. Anthony's. It's clear that we have many people who love our dear Lord. However sometimes we don't get to see just how each of you loves one another.

Week after week and event after event, the same core members tend to do the heavy lifting of our church. I draw your attention to this not simply to say 'thank you' to our faithful volunteers, but more urgently as a pastor in need of additional active members in his flock to work and share the load of responsibility.

I want to appeal in particular to those in their 20's, 30's, and 40's. Occasionally aging parents think they are protecting young parents by saying, "oh, you're too busy with the kids, you don't need to run around for church too...you can do that when you're older." Yet in reality, it is precisely the young, strong, creative, sharp-minded parishioners we need helping out the most. We can each truly answer Jesus' call to love one another by helping out in various ways here at St. Anthony's, and many of these are quite fun and rewarding in themselves.

A Vincentian Vocation



When Frederic Ozanam was studying at the University of Paris, the post-revolutionary Paris bristled with open hostility against anything Catholic or Christian. Frederic and other young students would often meet with their mentor, Monsieur Emmanuel Bailly to discuss and debate issues. One evening, the revolutionaries issued a challenge, "Christianity is now outworn and defunct. It may have been useful in the past, but what use is it today? What has Christianity to

offer? Where are its works now? Show us your works!" "Show us your works" pierced Frederic's heart and sent him and his companions to the poor so that they could put their faith into action. They quickly learned that they needed to organize formally to help the poor on a regular basis, both in order to serve the poor and so others could see the witness of their lives. On April 23, 1833 (*184 years ago this weekend*), Frederic Ozanam and his colleagues began the Conference of Charity and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was born. Together, they found the Vincentian secret that service must be motivated by love and that assistance to the poor must be given personally with sympathy, humility, compassion and respect. *Ponder and Pray: Is God calling me to be a Vincentian*?
