

The Life of St. Anthony of Padua

(part 4)

News of Anthony's preaching reached Francis of Assisi, who constantly urged his brother monks to commitment to a life of poverty. In this, he and Anthony saw eye to eye.

In 1224, Francis asked Anthony to oversee the instruction of the monks. Anthony had a book of psalms that contained his notes and comments to help when he was teaching students.

When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole Anthony's book. Anthony discovered it was missing, and prayed it would be found or returned to him. The thief did return the book and in an extra step returned to the Order as well.

The book is said to be preserved in the Franciscan friary in Bologna today.

Our Church Building Grows

In the early 1950's, it became apparent to the pastor, Fr. Frank Nestor, that St. Anthony's Parish was outgrowing its current space.

As remodeling began to take place, the plaster ceiling was removed. When Fr. Nestor saw the beautiful truss structure, he decided to leave it exposed. The original sanctuary and sacristies were torn down and the church was extended 55 ft. to the east to create a new



sanctuary area (*picture*). A transept on the north side for the choir and a crying room to the south were also added.

A baptistry area (our present Eucharistic adoration area) was added on the northwest corner of the church.

The lower portion of the church, Pius X Hall, was built after 1952 and used as a chapel. There had not been a basement previously, so the excavating and placing of the new footings was a labor-intensive process. Much of this work was done with wheelbarrows and shovels— and incredible human labor! A stairway to the Pius X chapel was also added.

The chapel was designed so that Masses could be offered in both places simultaneously to meet the needs of the parish. (1955 Parish Annual)



Pilgrimage to Rome

In October of 1950, a group from Fargo made a pilgrimage to Rome for the 1950 Holy Year. Msgr. Nestor and several St. Anthony parishioners were part of the group pictured here overlooking Rome.


The trip included an audience with Pope Pius XII.

ST. ANTHONY'S SCHOOL

St. Anthony's School continues to grow by leaps and bounds. In 1955, St. Anthony's purchased the former North Dakota Children's Home Society (pictured right) which was located directly across 8th Ave from the church. It became extra classroom space that was desperately needed. Extra classrooms were also added to the school building itself. There was even a classroom in the new church basement—accessed by way of the outside stairway on the south side of the newly constructed sacristy.

The school began a hot lunch program in 1955. Government commodities partially funded the lunch program and the cost to students was 35 cents for those who could afford it. No one went hungry!




St. Anthony's School had one of the first School Safety Patrols in Fargo. The location on a busy street and the fact that a deadly accident had occurred near the church justified creation of the patrol.



Fargo and the World 1947-1957

1948- KFGO radio begins broadcasting.

- 1948- American Crystal Sugar Company begins operating in nearby Moorhead, Minnesota.
- 1949– The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) is created.
- 1951 The United States tests the hydrogen bomb.
- 1954 Herschel Lashkowitz becomes mayor of Fargo.
- 1954– The US Supreme Court declares segregation unconstitutional.
- 1957 A tornado tears through north Fargo, killing ten people and causing massive destruction.

Fr. Nestor was interested and active in all aspects of parish life. In fact, Fr. Nestor participated personally in the physical work on the parish plant. During the excavation and construction of the Pius X Hall beneath the church in 1954, he was there, wielding a hammer and saw with the best of them.

Fr. Nestor was honored with the designation of Monsignor in 1955.

In October 1956, Patricia Carvell, a St. Anthony's parishioner and Roger Maris were married at St. Anthony's.

A PARISH PRIESTLY VOCATION

Msgr. Allan Nilles grew up in St. Anthony's Parish. He attended the school from 1929-1937 and was ordained to the priesthood in June of 1949.

and remains active celebrating Mass and is an amazing pianist. He is 93 years old.


