- 1. Who was the most influential person to you as a child? My mother.
- 2. Did you have any pets as a child? What kind? We had a dog and several cats.
- **3.** What did you do during the summertime as a child? Played and worked.
- **4.** What would people you know find surprising about you as a teen? I was slightly more extroverted than I appeared.
- 5. In what ways have your parents influenced you the most? They told me to work hard and pray hard. Mom and Dad loved being with each other at home. They didn't have to go out to have a good time. When Dad died, Mother said, "I always knew where he was. He was at work or he was home with me."
- 6. What is your most memorable travel experience? We didn't travel much. Most of our time was at home.
- 7. If you could possess one super-human power, what would it be? I would probably want two: Superhuman strength and intellect.
- 8. What is something that you'd love to be great at? Sports.
- 9. What is one lesson you've learned in life? The harder and more faithfully you work, the better your chances will be to succeed.
- **10.** What is something you've learned about the Faith since entering seminary? God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ really do love me personally and want me to love Them in return. The second lesson is that it is permissible and beneficial to have the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph as my spiritual parents.
