<u>CENTENNIAL CAMPAIGN CLOSES IN ON \$425,000!</u> PLUS 10% MATCHING GRANT FROM CATHOLIC FOUNDATION!

The Centennial Campaign is moving forward nicely. We now have 151 gifts and pledges totaling \$424,736. Thank you to all who have pledged!

In addition, on June 13, the Catholic Foundation awarded St. Anthony of Padua Church a Hommerding Incentive Fund grant of up to \$45,000 toward the facilities portion of the St. Anthony Centennial Campaign. The grant offers \$1 for each \$10 raised to go towards capital improvements (restoration, painting, new pews, etc.). That means St. Anthony's can take full advantage of the grant once we reach \$450,000 pledged towards the restoration! We are getting close, so please pledge soon if you have not done so already!


