

The Life of St. Anthony of Padua

(part 5)

Anthony spent time teaching at the universities in Montpellier and Toulouse in southern France but his true calling was to preach..

His simple and clear presentation of the Catholic faith was understandable by all. He possessed all the good qualities that characterize an eloquent preacher: a loud and clear voice, a winning countenance, a great memory, and a vast amount of knowledge.

He placed special emphasis on the denunciation of heresy the denial of a truth by a person who has been baptized, which must be believed with divine and Catholic faith.

For his straightforward preaching, Anthony was given the title of Malleus hereticorum (Hammer of the Heretics).

He spoke openly to all, to the rich and to the poor alike, to the people in the streets as well as those in positions of power and authority.

"We should speak then as the Holy Spirit gives us the gift of speech.
Our humble and sincere request to the Spirit for ourselves should be that we may bring the day of Pentecost to fulfillment."

Implementation of Vatican II at St. Anthony's

In October of 1962, St. Anthony's offered a novena for the success of the Second Vatican Council, called by Pope John XXIII, who died before it ended. Pope Paul VI led the Council to completion in 1965. About 2500 bishops and many leading Catholic theologians, religious, teachers and lay people as well as non-Catholic observers and delegates attended and contributed to the Council.

In 1964, permission was received to use English in the celebration of the Mass. The priests at St. Anthony's took time after the Gospel one Sunday in September to rehearse the upcoming changes that would begin the following week. A new booklet called "Prayers at Mass" was distributed. People coming to receive Communion were asked to come forward in two lines and to remain standing to receive Communion. The communion rail was removed.


Around 1965, St. Anthony's began to have lay lectors read the Scripture readings at Mass. Music, especially the singing of the congregation, was an important part of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum Concilium) and a choir was formed in December of 1967.

Sometimes the changes were a challenge for clergy and laity alike! Msgr. Nestor had a moveable altar built to accommodate the changes. Fr. John Anderson remembers how much he liked using English and facing the congregation for Mass but he said, "I will never forget Fr. Hilary Bitz coming to offer 6:45am Mass and pulling the altar as far forward as possible to the edge of the sanctuary. Msgr. Nestor would come to offer the 7:30am Mass and pull the altar as far back to the original large altar as possible. This went on morning after morning!"

Boy Scout Troop 11 walked 50 miles to Detroit Lakes-1958 or 59

Fr. Richard Carey, associate pastor at St. Anthony's from 1955 -60, and co-pastor from 1970-74 was, by all accounts, a vibrant and active parish priest.

In the 75th anniversary book Fr. Carey said, "Since I first became acquainted with St. Anthony's I have maintained that it is a great parish. There is a real love for the Eucharist here, demonstrated by the attendance at daily Mass. There are many people here who are living out the words of our Lord, 'If anyone wished to be my disciple, let him deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow me."



Led by Fr. Carey (front), the scouts arrived in Detroit Lakes on a Saturday at the end of a three-day trek. They camped near Buffalo State Park on Thursday, south of Lake Park the second night, and in the American Legion Lodge in Detroit Lakes on the third night, returning home by car on Sunday.



New Windows in the Church

From 1959 thru 1965, new windows were installed in the recently expanded church nave and sanctuary.

Bronislau Bak of the School of Art at St. John's in Collegeville, MN, worked with Msgr. Nestor to create the windows that we have today. The glass used was some of the best true antique glass attainable in the world at the time.

The artists and the benefactors who generously donated the win-

dows have given St. Anthony's Church a beautiful and prayerful treasure.

New Rectory and Administration Building

Plans for a new rectory were made and in 1966 the new Parish Administration Building and Rectory was completed on 10th Street between the church and Melting's Market. A tunnel was constructed to attach the new building to the church.

ST. ANTHONY"S SCHOOL

With the completion of Nativity's School building and subsequent opening in 1961, student numbers at St. Anthony's dropped from 817 to 514 from one year to the next!

Added to that, in 1962, grades 1-3 were closed down so that the teachers (sisters) could go back to school to get the education credits required to become state certified.

This caused an influx of 200 children into the South Side public elementary schools, posing a large problem as most of the classes had already been filled. Additional teachers needed to be hired and some boundary changes were made to accommodate the students.

By 1967 all grade levels were again staffed but enrollment continued to decline.

> ST. ANTHONY'S SCHOOL ENROLLMENT IN 1967 WAS 288 (down 337 students from 1957).

Religious Education Classes

In 1961 Bishop Dworschak initiated plans for a new Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) program of instruction in the Fargo Diocese. This program would serve the students who attended public school. St. Anthony's served as a pilot parish for the program.

With help from the Diocese and the Sisters of Service, and with Jerry Cossette serving as Principal, the program was officially started at St. Anthony's on September 29, 1962. There were 317 students in grades 1-8 and 34 volunteer teachers and helpers.

Msgr. Frank Nestor

-cont -

The late '60's brought many changes and more new construction to St. Anthony's.

Vatican II came to be during Msgr. Nestor's tenure at St. Anthony's and, as parish secretary, Grace Lawrence stated, "Monsignor was enthused and anxious to implement the changes recommended by the Council." (see the front page for details).

Msgr. Nestor is considered to be the father of the Cursillo movement in our region. As Fr. John Anderson remembers, "Msgr. Nestor often sat a the rectory dining room table and told his associates about his hopes and dreams of bringing the laity to a more active participation in the church." Fr. Anderson and Msgr. Nestor both attended Cursillos out of state and, in 1964, St. Anthony's hosted the first Men's Cursillo in Fargo. A few months later, the first women's Cursillo was held in Fargo.


