For Consideration: Establishing a St. Anthony Endowment

Questions and Answers 3/11/17

St. Anthony is considering the establishment of an endowment for the long-term benefit of the parish.

What is an endowment? "Endowment" refers to funds permanently restricted to use of earnings. For example, if \$100,000 were moved from St. Anthony's *savings account* to an "*endowment*" the annual *earnings* could be used, but the *principal* could not. If the \$100,000 principal earned 4% in a year, the parish would have \$4,000 to supplement the budget.¹ The primary benefit of an endowment is that it provides a supplemental source of revenue year after year.

How would it be funded? St. Anthony's Finance Council is considering setting aside \$100,000 from our savings as seed money to *initiate* the endowment. Hopefully, through a Centennial Campaign we can generate *an additional* \$300,000 over the next five years, growing the endowment to \$400,000.

The first dollars received from the campaign would pay for renovation of the sanctuary; then additional dollars would be earmarked for the Endowment.

In the *Project Overview* that was mailed to all parishioners in February, it was suggested that we wrap the sanctuary remodeling and the endowment together in one campaign. *Why combine the two objectives into one campaign?*

The Finance Council discussed this at length, and it boiled down to: "If not now, when?" There are 131 parishes in our diocese; 64 have parish endowments. We are the 15th largest parish in the diocese, and the only one in Fargo-West Fargo that has not begun funding an endowment.

The idea is to *initiate* the endowment as part of the campaign with gifts and monthly pledges over the next five years. By including an endowment in the Centennial Campaign, we hope to raise awareness and have people reflect on what St. Anthony has meant to them over the course of their life.

Hopefully, *over the decades* some parishioners would direct additional estate gifts *that continue to build the endowment*. For example, they might name St. Anthony in their will and direct the gift to the endowment.

Would we be asked to name St. Anthony in our will as part of the Centennial Campaign? The idea behind the Centennial campaign is to <u>kick-start</u> an endowment with <u>gifts</u> and <u>five-year pledges</u>. Beyond that—it's up to you whether you want to consider taking the additional step and name St. Anthony in your will. That is a *separate decision* that requires much time, reflection and perhaps conversation with family.

Could parishioners leave money in their will for a specific area of parish life? Yes. In addition to an endowed account to benefit the parish "where needs are greatest," there might be other accounts to benefit music ministry, youth ministry, outreach, education, or a host of other areas.

Could there be 'named' gifts to the endowment? Yes. For example, a parishioner might leave 10% of their estate for the establishment of the *John and Nancy Doe Fund for Youth Ministry*. Once established, earnings on that gift would be used to supplement the St. Anthony youth program. Later, to honor their parents, children and grandchildren could make additional gifts to build the fund well into the future.

Who would manage the endowment? The Catholic Development Foundation was established in 1989 to provide parishes and individuals a vehicle for long-term investing. The volume of assets under management allows the Catholic Development Foundation to negotiate favorable terms with money managers.
