Election Prayer by Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J.

Lord Jesus Christ, You told us to give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God. Enlighten the minds of our people [in] America. May we choose a President of the United States, and other government officials, according to Your Divine Will. Give our citizens the courage to choose leaders of our nation who respect the sanctity of unborn human life, the sanctity of marriage, the sanctity of marital relations, the sanctity of family, and the sanctity of aging. Grant us the wisdom to give You what belongs to You, our God. If we do this, as a nation, we are confident You will give us abundance of Your blessings through our elected leaders. Amen.

DID YOU KNOW... provided by your Parish Liturgy Committee

Did you know that the Catholic Church believes anyone can become a saint? Yes, **YOU** are called to seek holiness and sainthood. How does one be canonized a saint? *Here are 5 steps to sainthood*...

- 1. The person's local bishop investigates their life by gathering information from witnesses of their life and any writings they may have written. If the bishop finds them worthy of being a saint, then he submits the information gathered to the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints.
- 2. The Congregation for the Causes of Saints can choose to reject the application or accept it and begin their own investigation of the person's life.
- 3. If the Congregation for the Causes of Saints approves the candidate, they can choose to declare that the person lived a heroically virtuous life. This isn't a declaration that the person is in heaven, but that they pursued holiness while here on earth.
- 4. To be recognized as someone in heaven requires that a miracle has taken place through the intercession of that person. The miracle is usually healing. The healing has to be instantaneous, permanent, and complete while also being scientifically unexplainable. Miracles have to be first verified as scientifically unexplainable by a group of independent doctors, then the person is approved by a panel of theologians, and then the final approval lies with the pope. If this is the case, a person is declared a blessed.
- 5. A second miracle is needed in order to declare someone a saint. The confirmation of a second miracle goes through the same scrutiny as the first.






With the election right around the corner, you may be asked, "Why do Catholics have a Pope? Is he like their president? Their God? What does he do and what's the point?"

Msgr. Wendelyn Vetter died on October 20 at the age of 83. He served as a priest of the Fargo Diocese for 56 years, 11 of which were spent as pastor here at St. Anthony's. 
How to Draw Your Child Back to the Church!
