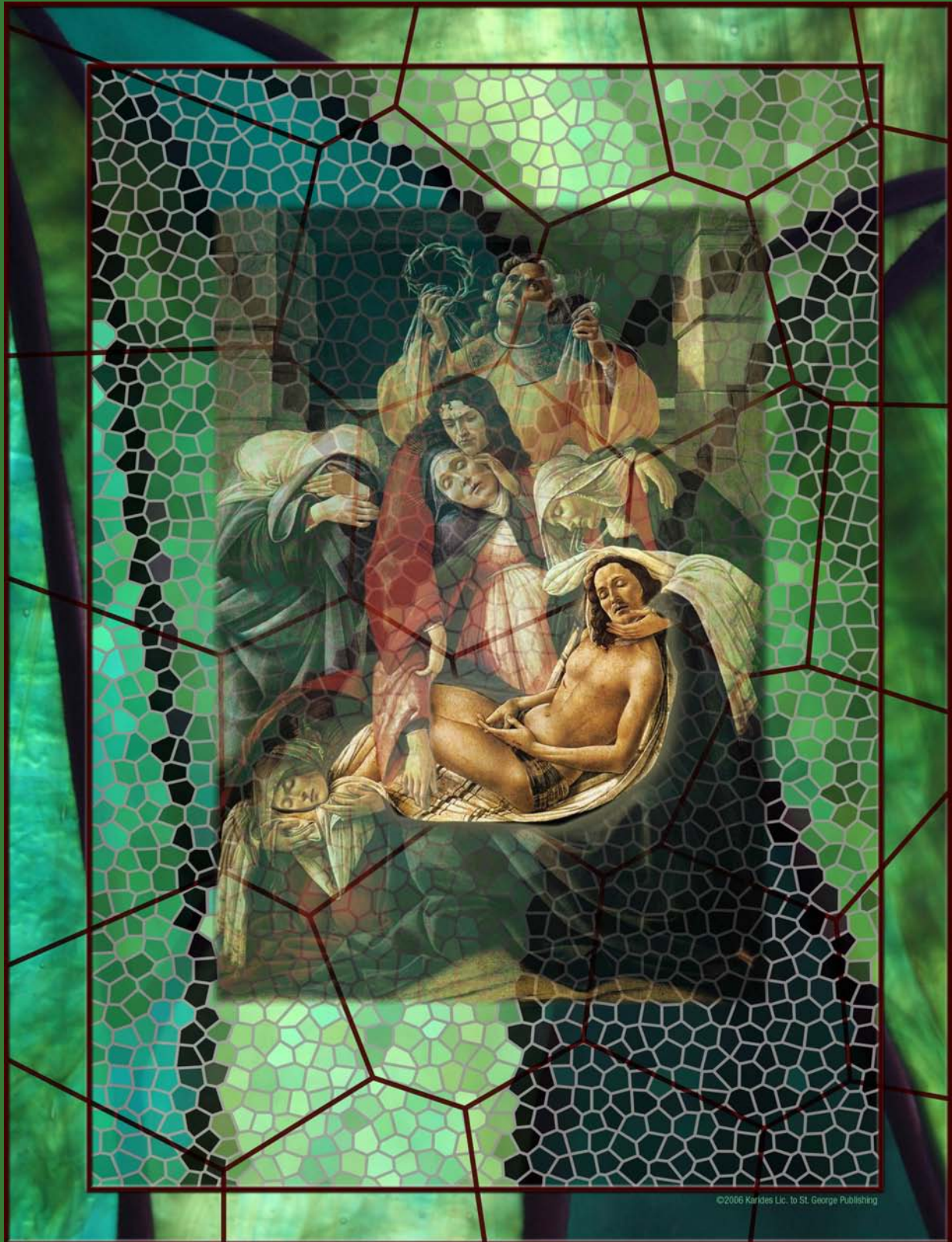

“How great is your goodness, Lord, stored up for those who fear you,
You display it for those who trust you, in the sight of all the people.

“Be still before the Lord; wait for God.” *(Ps 31:7a)*

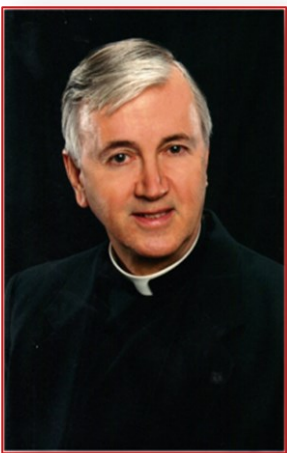

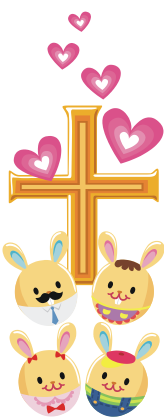
