The Beauty of Eucharistic Adoration: "Be Still and Know that I Am God" (Ps 46:11)

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In his Apostolic Exhortation, the *Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis says: "The Church urgently needs the deep breath of prayer, and to my great joy groups devoted to prayer and intercession, the prayerful reading of God's word, and the perpetual adoration of the Eucharist are growing at every level of ecclesial life." As Archbishop and Cardinal of Buenos Aires, Pope Francis spoke much about the tremendous need of Catholics for adoration.

Pope St. John Paul II said, "the Church and the world have a great need of Eucharistic adoration." He also said: "Jesus waits for us in the Sacrament of Love." (Domincae Cenae) In his encyclical, *The Redeemer of Man*, he wrote: "Our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete."

Popo Paul VI also spoke powerfully about the need for Eucharistic adoration. He said, for example, "How great is the value of conversation with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, for there is nothing more consoling on earth, nothing more efficacious for advancing along the road of holiness.... Christ is truly the Emmanuel, that is, God with us, day and night. He is in our midst. He dwells with us full of grace and truth. He restores morality, nourishes virtue, consoles the afflicted, strengthens the weak." (Mysterium Fidei)

We need more persons for adoration on most Fridays, especially between the hours of 11am to 2pm and 6pm to 9pm. (See the specific times on page -- of this bulletin) We also hope to begin adoration on the first Monday of every month from 10am until 9pm.

If you are able to spend one hour or more with Jesus, our best Friend, call Fr. Reilly.

There are many biblical reasons for wanting to be with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. First, He Is truly Present. Jesus said: "I myself Am the Living Bread come down from Heaven." (Jn 6:35)

Second, He said: "Could you not watch one hour with Me?" (Mt 26:40)

Third, Jesus Is the Divine Physician who heals you. He desires a deeper friendship with you. Jesus said: "Come to Me all of you who are weary and find life burdensome and I will refresh you." (Mt 11:28) "Cast all of your anxieties upon the One who dares for you." (1Pet 5:7) "My peace is My gift to you." (Jn 14:17)

Fourth, each hour you spend with Jesus will make your soul more beautiful in Heaven. Jesus said: "They who humble themselves shall be exalted." (Lk 18:14) "All of us gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces, are being transformed from glory to glory into His very image." (2Cor 3:18)

And fifth, Jesus will bless you, your family and our world for the hour you spend with Him. Jesus said: "Faith can move mountains." (Mk 11:23) "What is needed is trust." (Mk 5:36) "Behold, I make all things new." (Rev 21:5)

Let us finish with this quote from Pope St. John Paul II: "I encourage Christians to regularly visit Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament, for we are all called to abide in the presence of God. In contemplation, Christians will perceive ever more profoundly the Mystery at the heart of Christian life."


