Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2015 "The Birthday of the Church"

Jesus' promise to send the "Counselor" and
"Spirit of Truth" is fulfilled.

Before Jesus was crucified, he told his disciples that the Holy Spirit would come after him:

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever — the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. (John 14:16–18)

40 days after the Resurrection, that promise was fulfilled when Peter and the early Church were in Jerusalem for Pentecost:

They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. (Acts 2:1–4)

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In our Scriptures during this Easter season, we've been hearing a lot about "mission." In today's Gospel, for example, Jesus said to His Heavenly Father: "As you sent Me into the world, so I sent them into the world."

Jesus has a mission for everyone. For family members, it means doing one's best to make the home a holy place, where love of Jesus and neighbor takes first place. Going to Mass every Sunday is essential. Jesus expects you to be there.

Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman (1801-1890) wrote this reflection on mission. It applies to everyone.

God know me and calls me by my name... God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission - I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next.

Somehow I am necessary for His purposes... I have a part in the great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. My sickness, or perplexity, or sorrow may be necessary causes of some great end, which is quite beyond us. He does nothing in vain; He may prolong my life, He may shorten it; He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers, He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me - still He knows what He is about.... Let me by Thy blind instrument, I ask not to see - I ask not to know - I ask simply to be used.

Blessed Newman was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on September 19, 2010. In 2001, John Sullivan, a 62 year old Boston man prayed through the intercession of Venerable Newman. He was miraculously cured from lumbar disc disease. The disease had produced severe pain and incapacity to walk. A study by physicians concluded that there was no medical explanation for the man's instantaneous cure. In 2009, the Holy See approved the cure as a miracle attributed to the intercession of Venerable Newman.

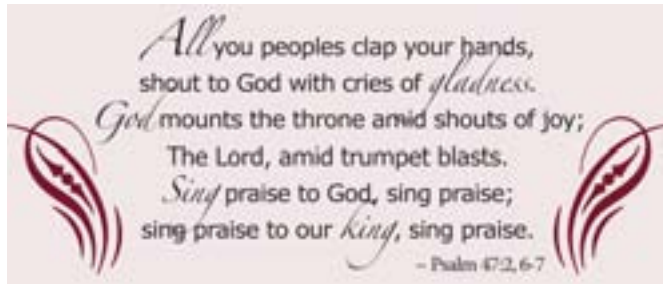

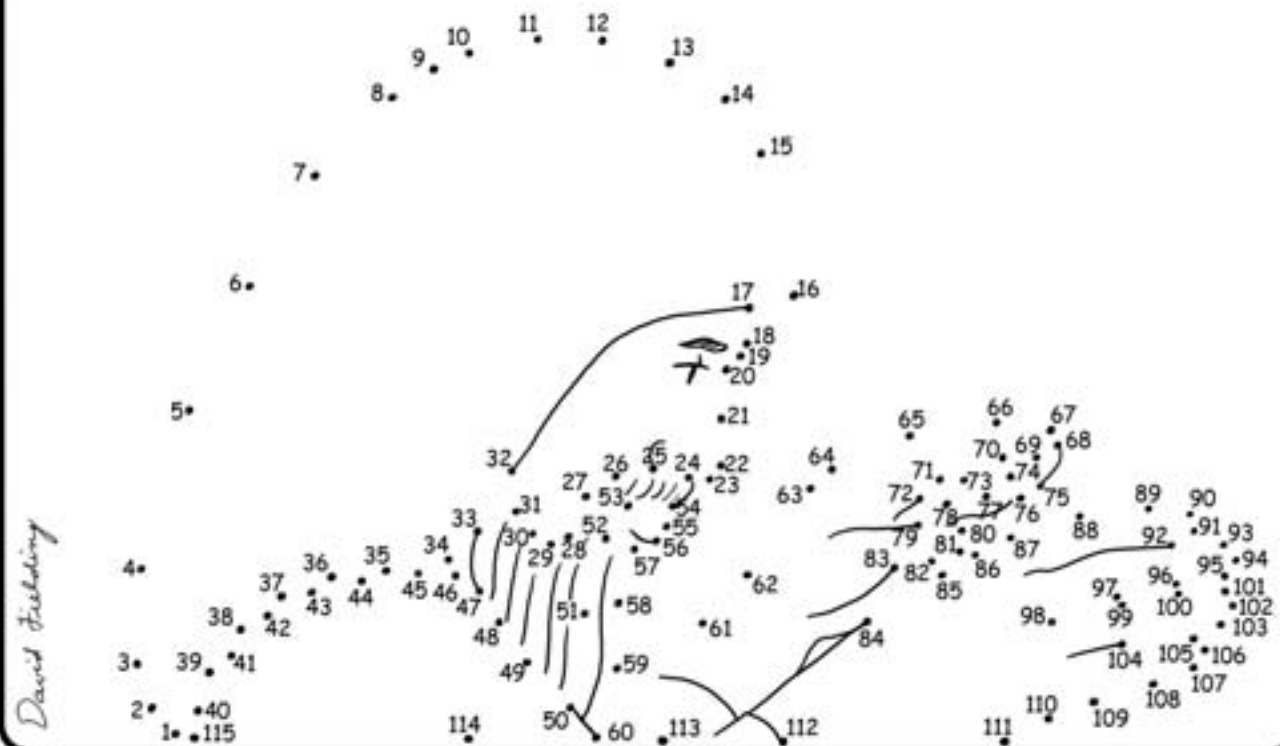


