# Letter from Fr. John



Dear Parishioners,

It has now been a little over two months since I began my assignment as Parochial Administrator of our parishes of St. Joseph, St. Anne and St. Francis. I suppose some of you may wonder what the difference is between a parochial administrator and pastor. There is no difference in authority or duties. The only difference is one of stability. Canon Law (Church law) describes the appointment of a parochial administrator as temporary. This means that the Bishop could move a parochial administrator at a moment's notice for any reason he would deem necessary. A bishop cannot do that with a pastor who has certain rights of stability under Canon Law.

With that in mind one of my goals has been to ensure that Diocesan policies and practices are in place at each of the parishes in anticipation of when the Bishop does assign a pastor to you. I would prefer to have things in line as much as possible before my term as Administrator is deemed over. One of the things I have looked at is reconstituting the councils (finance and parish). These councils are important for good communication among parishioners and pastor (administrator) and also for the good stewardship of the temporal goods of the parish. I am looking to add to the councils in Ash Fork and Seligman. Ideally we would have at least three people on each council. Thank you to all who have accepted the call to serve.

At St. Joseph the current construction of the councils are as follows:
