Dear parishioners and visitors,

It is the practice of the diocese that whenever there is a parish cluster, there should be only one celebration of the Holy Triduum, i.e., Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. The purpose is to have all parishioners come to one church for the celebration instead of duplication due to the length of the Masses and services. The Triduum is to be held at the same church for all three celebrations.

Even though it would not be necessary to do so in our cluster, I have made the decision to follow the policy for these reasons:

- 1) The number of people who attend is not great. One church can hold easily the number;
- 2) With all the many things that are celebrated during Holy Week, it is good to have one set of celebrations in one church.

Since the bishop is the pastor of the Cathedral, and the chief shepherd of the faithful in the diocese, it is appropriate to have him as the principal celebrant of the Triduum. Since the Cathedral is his church, it is right the celebrations be held at the Cathedral. The schedule for the Triduum and Easter Sunday are below. I will ask members of both parishes to participate in the washing of the feet at the Holy Thursday Mass, and servers from both to assist in the celebrations. The permanent deacons assigned to this cluster will be assisting the bishop.

The intercession this week is to pray for all those preparing to either be baptized or received in to the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil this year.

Our Holy Father has asked that in this Jubilee Year of Mercy there be extended prayer and confessions before the Fourth Sunday of Lent (March 6th) when we will hear the gospel passage from the gospel of St. Luke on the Prodigal Sunday. In our deanery, the priests decided that since the all-day confession is a tradition it would be most appropriate to have the sacrament available. The date is Friday, March 4th at the Cathedral from 1:00 – 9:00 PM. This gives those who cannot come earlier a chance to go to confession. Even though there will be the all-day on Monday, March 21, you are encouraged to come on the 4th if at all possible. There will be four priests hearing every hour. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from after the 12:10 PM Mass through the end of Stations of the Cross at 5:10 PM.

#### **Home: The First Threshold of Mercy**

One of the big events of the Year of Mercy was the opening of the Holy Door at Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome. The door represents Jesus as the door through which we must pass to eternal life. Jesus calls Himself the "Sheep's Gate" and tells us "nobody comes to the Father except through Me." When we walk through a "Holy Door" a special outpouring of Jesus' mercy is granted through simple acts of devotion. So it is especially appropriate that the Holy Door was opened during this Jubilee celebration. But not only did Pope Francis open the Holy Door at St. Peter's, he called for every diocese in the world to designate Holy Doors in cathedrals and shrines, showing the overflowing abundance and availability of God's mercy.

Then Pope Francis took the Church's message of mercy even further when he encouraged every family to make the door to their own home a door of mercy. Now, this doesn't mean that walking through the door of a home automatically gives you a special outpouring of Jesus' mercy. That wasn't the Holy Father's intention. His intent was to remind us that mercy begins at home.

The family is referred to as the "deeper school of humanity" (Vatican II, Gaudium et Spes, n. 52). By God's design, it is where we first experience Jesus' great and abundant mercy. Feeding the hungry (children), consoling the sick, admonishing the sinner and the like are common practices at home. As the corporal and spiritual works of mercy repeatedly play out each day, the family becomes more skilled at expressing loving kindness, compassion and forgiveness to those who offend. Over time, the home becomes a place of free-flowing mercy.

Becoming a merciful family and creating a peaceful home is hard work. Learning to love isn't easy because family life is messy. It is easy to forget that our homes are to be sanctuaries of charity and forgiveness. That is why Pope Francis asks us to imagine that the following three expressions are written above

### Sacraments & Services

**Baptism:** Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. the main door of our home: "May I"; "Thank you"; "Pardon Me". Envisioning these phrases will remind us that we are crossing a threshold of mercy when we enter our home.

#### "May I"

The common life of a family is strengthened when the phrase "May I" is used to ask for something. This simple gesture of respect has the power to keep life within the home intact "even when tested with a thousand problems". Saying "may I" teaches us to walk more gently with each other, to ask more politely, and even to seek the permission of our family members before we make our wills known.

#### "Thank You"

We often say "thank you" for favors granted to us. But to really say "thank you" in the context of family love is to truly appreciate the goodness in each family member. Families should be a place where we draw out each other's goodness and truly appreciate that goodness. Openly expressing gratitude prevents pettiness from cracking the family foundation and cultivates good relations among family members that are firmly rooted in charity and respect.

#### "Pardon Me"

Pope Francis tells us that "If we are not able to forgive ourselves, then we are no longer able to forgive period. A house in which the words "I'm sorry" are never uttered begins to lack air, and the floodwaters begin to choke those who live inside." (General Audience May 15, 2015) This is why every family needs forgiveness. But for forgiveness to be given, it must first be sought. We have to learn to admit when we are wrong, especially when we cause harm (even when we didn't mean to). Apologizing to one another is not a sign of weakness. Rather, in recognizing our faults and asking for forgiveness, the bonds of love and trust between family members are deepened.

#### **LENTEN REGULATIONS**

**ABSTINENCE** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this law may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these minimal prescribed penitential practices.

It was a month reflective of general help but a sad month for others—among them, a father who sought travel assistance to go to the funeral of his son who was killed in a drive-by shooting, a mother of three teens who went to surgery not knowing that she would have her vocal cords when she awoke, and a couple of mothers on fixed incomes who had eviction notices, one a victim of theft and the other of fraud.

Many who come to the Front Door are sick, frightened, jobless, homeless, depressed. Some are abuse victims, others, just released from confinement. The ministry which you provide is recognized throughout the area. There is networking done with agencies and other churches in the area. The guidelines for which help is given are enforced to minimize fraud and entitlement. Daily records are kept. No money is given directly for assistance.
