Dear Parishioners of St. James the Less,

In 1986, Bishop John Paul convened the fourth diocesan synod. One of the many things that came from it was that every parish was to have a pastoral council as well as a finance council. The purpose of the pastoral council is to have parishioners work with the pastor for the well-being of the parish. The council is to be concerned with all aspects of the life of the parish except temporal goods or finances which is the task of the finance council.

This council is advisory to the pastor who is the president of the council and could be the chairperson as well. Over the years at St. James, the pastoral council has not been as active. Presently, there is a list of people but there is only one active member plus me. The council has not met officially for some time. I want to re-activate the council. I have made it a goal this fiscal year to have this council functioning again. I hope it will be in place so that we can begin meeting this fall. Once it is up-and-running, the next goal is to have the four standing committees of the council in place and operating: Catholic education, family life, sacred worship and social justice.

I trust there are parishioners who will consider being on the council. I ask that you pray about it over the next several weeks. In the near future, I will ask for parishioners to submit their names to me. Candidates should have a genuine concern for the entire well-being parish. The make-up of the council should be parishioners of all ages and backgrounds. Those interested must be baptized and confirmed in the Catholic faith, and registered members. I am targeting the month of May to have the elections. Members are to be elected (2/3) and appointed by the pastor (1/3).

LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS

The Cathedral Parish continues its Lenten Soup Suppers during the Friday's of Lent in the Undercroft. As in other years the people of the parish are being asked to donate yeast or sweetbreads for each of the suppers. They can be dropped off in the Undercroft near the kitchen. PRAYER AND CONFESSIONS

Our Holy Father has asked that in this Jubilee Year of Mercy there be extended prayer and confessions before the Fourth Sunday of Lent (March 6th) when we will hear the gospel passage from the gospel of St. Luke on the Prodigal Sunday. In our deanery, the priests decided that since the all-day confession is a tradition it would be most appropriate to have the sacrament available. The date is Friday, March 4th at the Cathedral from 1:00 - 9:00 PM. This gives those who cannot come earlier a chance to go to confession. Even though there will be the all-day on Monday, March 21st, you are encouraged to come on the 4th if at all possible. There will be four priests hearing every hour. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from after the 12:10 PM Mass through the end of Stations of the Cross at 5:10 PM.

OLD PALMS

In preparation for Palm Sunday on March 20th, if you have old palms to rid, there will be a box in the aisle that leads from the cathedral to the sacristy. Since palms are blessed, they should not be thrown into the garbage but rather disposed properly. The box will remain there until the end of April.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

FASTING is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this law may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these minimal prescribed penitential practices.

ROSARY

The Rosary is prayed prior to Mass, Monday through Friday at 7:35 am.
