





The Gospel Parable on the 17th Sunday ~ Mt 13:47-50

Jesus said to His disciples, ""The kingdom of heaven is like a net thrown into the sea, which collects fish of every kind. When it is full they haul it ashore and sit down to put what is good into buckets. What is bad they throw away. Thus it will be at the end of the age. PRO LIFE - NO APOLOGIES

The Didache, also known as The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, is an early Christian treatise, dating to the first century. The first line of this treatise is "The teaching of the Lord to the Gentiles (or Nations) by the twelve apostles". The text, parts of which constitute the oldest extant written catechism, has three main sections dealing with Christian ethics, rituals such as baptism and Eucharist, and Church organization. The opening chapters describe the virtuous Way of Life and the wicked Way of Death.

Ch. 1: The Two Ways; The First Commandment

There are two ways, one of life and one of death; but a great difference between the two ways. The way of life, then, is this: First, you shall love God who made you; second, your neighbor as yourself....

Ch. 2: The Second Commandment: Gross Sin Forbidden

And the second commandment of the Teaching; You shall not commit murder, you shall not commit adultery . . . you shall not commit fornication, you shall not steal . . . <u>you shall not</u> murder a child by abortion nor kill that which is begotten.


