

By Dr. Scott Hahn Consuming Fire

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle C)

Jeremiah 38:4–6, 8–10 Psalm 40:2–4, 18 Hebrews 12:1–4 Luke 12:49–53

Our God is a consuming fire, the Scriptures tell us (see Hebrews 12:29; Deuteronomy 4:24).

And in this week's Gospel, Jesus uses the image of fire to describe the demands of discipleship.

The fire he has come to cast on the earth is the fire that he wants to blaze in each of our hearts. He made us from the dust of the earth (see Genesis 2:7), and filled us with the fire of the Holy Spirit in baptism (see Luke 3:16).

We were baptized into his death (see Romans 6:3). This is the baptism our Lord speaks of in the Gospel this week. The baptism with which He must be baptized is His passion and death, by which He accomplished our redemption and sent forth the fire of the Spirit on the earth (see Acts 2:3).

The fire has been set, but it is not yet blazing. We are called to enter deeper into the consuming love of God. We must examine our consciences and our actions, submitting ourselves to the revaling fire of God's Word (see 1 Corinthians 3:13).

In our struggle against sin, we have not yet resisted to the point of shedding our own blood, Paul tells us in this week's Epistle. We have not undergone the suffering that Jeremiah suffers in the First Reading this week.

But this is what true discipleship requires. To be a disciple is to be inflamed with the love of the God. It is to have an unquenchable desire for holiness and zeal for the salvation of our brothers and sisters.

Being His disciple does not bring peace in the false way that the world proclaims peace (see Jeremiah 8:11). It means division and hardship. It may bring us to conflict with our own flesh and blood.

But Christ is our peace (see Ephesians 2:14). By his cross, he has lifted us up from the mire of sin and death—as he will rescue the prophet Jeremiah (see Jeremiah 38:10).

And as we sing in the Psalm this week, we trust in our deliverer.

From Fr. Carlos

I begin this week where I ended last week, with the fire that the Lord wants to set upon the Earth. I've spoken before of the lie we've given into of the "domesticated Jesus." Some people would like to think of Jesus as a weak and marshmallowy figure who just accepts everyone exactly as they are and doesn't demand anything of anyone except that we love each other in some vague and undemanding way. It is true that Jesus welcomes everyone, especially those who have been ostracized by others because of their past, but He never leaves them where they are. Every encounter with Jesus sends the person off as a redeemed person starting off a new life, and many of these encounters end with Jesus' admonition to, "go and sin no more."

It's also true that Jesus is best described by love, but His love is not best seen as a warm and somewhat suffocating hug. Jesus' love for all of us is best seen in the world's widest embrace as He hung upon the cross and through His suffering took upon Himself all our sins and brokenness so that we might be set free. Jesus is not afraid of love which challenges and stretches. He is certainly not a shy and retiring figure.

So, as His followers what sort of people should we be? Many of us are familiar with the expression WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?). The thought behind this saying often seems to be to get people to think in a more peaceable and gentle way. However, we have to remember that Jesus, who tended to the sick, who reached out to the sinner and who welcomed the little children, is the same Jesus who showed moments of righteous anger; who upended the tables of the money changers in the temple, and who was not afraid to call people out for their hypocrisy.

This week, Jesus speaks of His desire for the world to be ablaze. He reminds us that to be His followers, means to be people who welcome the stranger and the suffering person, but it also means that we must be willing to challenge people when we see them settling into ways of life which are not fitting for a son or daughter of God. It means that we must be willing to stand out from the crowd and be the source of light in the midst of popular darkness. If we are true to our call as followers of Jesus, we know that we will not always be accepted. That is the contradiction He speaks of this week. It's not that we must intentionally cause division in our relationships, but rather that we cannot compromise truth simply to appease others. Being a Christian is not about blending in and being complacent. Being a Christian is about blazing with God's love, and being that spark which sets the world ablaze. It is a demanding call, but all lives worth living and all love worth sharing is demanding, and stretches us in new ways. It's also an exciting call because Jesus promises us that in following Him, we may experience suffering, but we'll also experience joys and rewards far greater than anything we could conceive for ourselves. As you hear God's invitation, you can choose to live safely and not rock the boat, or you can choose to become a spark of God's love. The choice is yours.
