Gateway to Life

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle C)

Isaiah 66:18-21 Psalm 117:1, 2

Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Luke 13:22-30

Jesus doesn't answer the question put to Him in this Sunday's Gospel. It profits us nothing to speculate on how many will be saved. What we need to know is what He tells us today - how to enter into salvation and how urgent it is to strive now, before the Master closes the door.

Jesus is "the narrow gate," the only way of salvation, the path by which all must travel to enter the kingdom of the Father (see John 14:6).

In Jesus, God has come - as He promises in this week's First Reading - to gather nations of every language, to reveal to them His glory.

Eating and drinking with them, teaching in their streets, Jesus in the Gospel is slowly making His way to Jerusalem. There, Isaiah's vision will be fulfilled: On the holy mountain He will be lifted up (see John 3:14), will draw to Himself brethren from among all the nations - to worship in the heavenly Jerusalem, to glorify Him for His kindness, as we sing in Sunday's Psalm.

In God's plan, the kingdom was proclaimed first to the Israelites and last to the Gentiles (see Romans 1:16; Acts 3:25-26), who in the Church have come from the earth's four corners to make up the new people of God (see Isaiah 43:5-6; Psalm 107:2-3).

Many however will lose their place at the heavenly table, Jesus warns. Refusing to accept His narrow way they will weaken, render themselves unknown to the Father (see Isaiah 63:15-16).

We don't want to be numbered among those of drooping hands and weak knees (see Isaiah 35:3). So we must strive for that narrow gate, a way of hardship and suffering - the way of the beloved Son.

As this week's Epistle reminds us, by our trials we know we are truly God's sons and daughters. We are being disciplined by our afflictions, strengthened to walk that straight and narrow path - that we may enter the gate, take our place at the banquet of the righteous.

From Fr. Carlos

Jesus continues this week with the topic of faith and eternal salvation. He puts the reality of eternal life in no uncertain terms when He says, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." (Luke 13:24) It is possible for all of us to get to heaven, but it's not a guaranteed journey since the gate by which we enter is narrow and undertaking the journey requires commitment on our part.

In discussing heaven and salvation with family members and friends who belong to protestant churches, it is natural for some confusion to arise. Part of the confusion comes up because our beliefs are somewhat different. If they weren't different, the splits between various protestant churches and the Catholic Church would not remain. Another part of the confusion arises because Catholics and Protestants often use different words to mean the same thing.

For instance, most Protestants hold to the position of *Sola Fide*, which is to say that we are saved by faith alone. This is often contrasted with the Catholic position of faith and works. However, both positions expressed in this way are a bit of a caricature. Some Protestants do believe that all that is necessary for us to get into heaven is to kneel down at a particular moment and accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior, but most recognize that it takes more than that. At the same time, when Catholics speak of "works," it's not as though we're saying that if we do enough good deeds then we get a high enough score to get into heaven. When Saint James speaks of justification by works and not faith alone (James 2:24), he is not speaking of a checklist. What he's speaking about is a living faith. Faith is a gift from God. When we receive it, we need to bring it to life and let it transform our lives. Therefore, it is only natural that a person's gift of faith will be manifested in works such as acts of praise towards God and acts of charity towards his neighbors. Faith in order to justify us cannot just be declared... it must be lived.

We may also stumble when people ask if we've been saved, because again some see it as a matter of a one-time commitment, but we see it differently. If salvation were a one-time commitment, Saint Paul would not have instructed the Philippians to "work out their salvation with fear and trembling." (Phil 2:12). Therefore, when faced with the question as to whether we have been saved, we can say "yes," but if given the opportunity we should explain further. First of all, we are saved in the sense that we're placed by Baptism and by faith in a right relationship with God. Secondly, we are still being saved because we are constantly being strengthened and perfected. Lastly, we still hope to be saved, because we hope to get to heaven, but our journey isn't over yet.
