



From Fr. Molini

Thanks, and keep praying

Thank you for the messages of support and gratitude for my comments at Mass last week. As I said, disgusted as I am by the actions of some of our leaders, I am greatly encouraged by the efforts being made on the parish level to care and protect all those we serve. I encourage you to keep leaders aware of your observations and expectations (that includes me and our parish leaders). Keep asking questions. Keep expecting the best. Maybe here is the right place to remember, "Trust, but verify." I do believe what the Church is, and has to offer, is of eternal value. As Peter asks in today's Gospel, "Master, to whom shall we go?" In the Church we have the Precious Eucharist, the Sacrifice of the Mass, the Saints in Heaven, and the Church on earth. I cannot find it elsewhere and I need the Church to help me grow into my full stature as a child of God. As His Body on earth, we will make His presence known. Again, I rely upon the promise of Jesus to remain with his Church and the witness of history which shows our growth through trial. Let us support and care for each other in this Faith, in this Hope, as Beloved children of God.

From Fr. Lampe

Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist Part 1

Jesus spoke about eating His flesh and drinking His blood in the Gospel in John 6. He refers to Himself as the Bread from Heaven. When many disciples were disgusted with the idea of eating His flesh and drinking His blood, they grumbled about it. Surely, Jesus couldn't mean really eating His flesh, could He? Jesus responded by using even stronger language to make His point that He means His real flesh and blood, not a sign or symbol. The crowd then dispersed and many of them returned to their former way of life. It seems Jesus would rather have the crowd believe that they must eat His real flesh and drink His real blood, and leave Him, then have them stay and believe that He meant it only figuratively.

Our tradition holds His Real Presence as well. Early Church Fathers such as St. Ignatius of Antioch, who was a disciple of St. John the Apostle, and St. Irenaeus, who was a disciple of St. Polycarp (a disciple of St. John the Apostle), held in their teaching that the Eucharist is really Jesus Christ. That He is truly present in what appears to be bread and wine. The idea that the Eucharist is only a sign or symbol was condemned as heresy in the 11th century, because the bread and wine really become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is infallibly taught by the Council of Trent in the 16th Century.

Still it can be difficult for us to accept this teaching. St. Thomas Aquinas can help us. First, we can know by faith and by our sense of sound that it is different. When the priest speaks the words of Christ "This is my Body" and "This is the chalice of my Blood" we know that what once was bread and wine is now Jesus Christ. The substance changes. A substance is what a thing is. "Sub" meaning under and "stance" meaning stand. What stands under the appearance is what a thing is. Usually the appearance corresponds to what it is, but not so with the Eucharist.

ASCENSION ST. VINCENT DE PAUL 2018 YEAR TO DATE SUMMARY (Through June)


The mission of our St. Vincent De Paul Conference is to witness God's love by providing person-to-person service to the needy and suffering.

The following results could not have been accomplished without your generous support.

- + We assisted 96 individuals within Ascension Parish boundaries.
- + Services provided outside our parish boundaries include: 2,162 individuals served at our St. Nicholas Food Pantry. 756 meals were prepared and served to the homeless and needy at St. Vincent de Paul Church in St. Louis City.
- + Regular financial support is given to 8 struggling SVDP Conferences.
- + Our Conference members worked 3,538 hours in their Vincentian efforts.

Ascension SVDP 2018 YTD EXPENSES (through June)








