

A Message From Our Pastor.

Dear Friends.

One of the most beautiful and comforting images of Jesus is that of the Good Shepherd. Even though the pictures of a perfectly white flock of sheep gathered around the feet of Jesus are unrealistic (sheep can be pretty muddy and they are among the stupidest creatures God ever bothered to create), still it has a powerful hold on us. All of us, no matter what our station in life, need someone to lean on, someone whose advice and leadership we can always depend on.

Sometimes we hear of priests being referred to as the "shepherd" of their "flock." The sentiment is well meaning but it is wrong. There is only one Good Shepherd – Jesus Christ. We are all the members of His flock. I remember being told in the seminary that a more accurate terminology for the pastor is the sheepdog of the Good Shepherd. The sheepdog runs around in circles, never really sure of what the plan is, but knowing that if everyone is going in the same direction, if we are all headed toward the path of Jesus, then he is doing a good job.

Beginning last week, every week during the Prayers of the Faithful until June, we pray by name for each of the eight new priests to be ordained for ministry in the Diocese. Please pray for priests. May the honor and dignity of being a priest of Jesus Christ not go to our heads. May we never be self-centered priests. If we boast of anything, may it be that we have been privileged to be counted among the sheepdogs of the Good Shepherd, Christ the Lord.



Saints This Week

Blessed Marie de l'Incarnation

Marie Guyard was born in Tours, France in 1599 and married Claude Martin in 1616. They had one son, also named Claude. Her husband died the next year. In 1633, after young Claude had begun studying at a Benedictine monastery (he ultimately became a Benedictine monk), Marie entered the Ursuline convent in Tours, taking the name Marie de l'Incarnation.

Although New France (Quebec) was ruled by France for nearly a hundred years by this time, the European presence consisted mostly of fish drying beds, fur trading posts and missions. The city of Quebec wasn't established until 1608 and even then it was an all-male military post, until Louis and Marie Hebert with their three children, five cows and crates of poultry arrived in 1617 to establish a farm. Soon other families joined them.

Marie de l'Incarnation, in her cloister in Tours, realized that if there were children, they needed a

school. With permission of her superior, she and another Sister founded the Ursuline Academy in Quebec in 1639. Most of her students were Indian girls and she educated French and Indian girls together. She did a much better job educating girls than the Jesuits did with Indian boys, because she learned their languages. She wrote dictionaries in Iroquois, Algonquin and Huron. The community grew with vocations from young women of both French and Indian backgrounds.

In spite of a very busy life as a teacher and an administrator, often on a shoestring budget, she had a deep and profound spiritual life, which we know of through her letters to her son. She wrote, "God has never led me by a feeling of fear, but always by a spirit of love and trust."



Marie de l'Incarnation died in Quebec on April 30, 1672, but her work continues. In 1697, another school was opened in Trois-Rivieres and the schools spread throughout Quebec but also throughout North America. Ursuline Academy was founded in New Orleans, then French territory, in 1727, which is the first girls' school in what is now the United States, as well as the oldest Catholic school. Other schools were established in Boston (Charlestown) in 1824, Galveston, Texas in 1849, and the Ursulines began working on Indian reservations in Montana in 1893. Today the Ursuline Academy in Quebec has over 400 students and there is another school in suburban Loretteville.

Blessed Marie is called the Mother of the Church in Canada, but she could equally be called the Mother of Catholic Education in North America.
