SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR APR 15

Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19; 1 John 2:1-5a; Luke 24:35-48

A Word from the Pastor

Not too long ago, a homeless man came up to me after Mass and hugged me, saying, "I felt the mercy of God here!" I responded that I was happy for him, and I said that's why all of us come to church: to experience the love and the mercy of God. Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, a day to reflect upon, and to imitate, the love of God shown to us in Jesus Christ. It seems unusual that we have to be reminded of the mercy of God, but many people see religion as something quite the opposite: obeisance to an angry God who expects propitiatory sacrifices to hold back his punishment. Here I think of the 18th century Protestant preacher and theologian, Jonathan Edwards, whose sermon "Sinners in the Hands of Angry God" still causes terror. Or even the heretical Jansenism movement of 17th and 18th century France, which emphasized the depravity of humanity and the just punishment of God. St. Margaret Mary, and her promotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, was a counterbalance to the rigorism of Jansenism, reminding Catholics that God's love and mercy are always available to those in need.

Divine Mercy Sunday is yet another reminder that sinners are not in the hands of an angry God. Rather, "while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" and offered us the hope of eternal life. If Easter is about anything, it is about victory over sin and death—our sin and death that hold us captive. As one of our hymns says, "For Christ conquered death in his rising to new life, rejoice in the power of the truth."

Part of that truth is our belief in the resurrection and a life beyond this life. The Resurrection of Jesus tells us that there is more to life than meets the eye, that the immutable laws of nature are not so immutable, and that the veil between time and eternity has been rent in two.

Some see the Resurrection of Jesus as merely a myth (a symbol, but not "real"). If the Resurrection were just a myth, or a story—something out of a comic book—it probably would have played out differently. Something like this: Jesus, the Hero, was taken by the Romans, tortured, horribly killed on a cross, and buried. But Jesus the Hero came back, alive again—taking vengeance on the bad guys, standing triumphant before the enemy.

In fact, something quite different happened. Instead, after showing his wounds to his frightened disciples, Jesus says, "Peace be with you." Peace be with you! Not an "eye for an eye." Jesus showed us 1) that peace, not war, restores order; 2) that love, not hate, establishes justice; 3) that reconciliation, not aggression, brings light to those in darkness and healing to those who mourn. Jesus became the best example of his own teaching: that there is nothing more powerful than love and mercy and forgiveness. It can even raise one from the dead. And it did!
