#### A Word from the Pastor

I want to give an update on our capital campaign and our Cathedral Project. First of all, I want to thank Ed Lemma and his company, Development Services Group, for his valuable assistance in our capital campaign. Through Ed's efforts, and numerous campaign committee members, over 450 parish households have pledged to the campaign for an amazing inhouse total of nearly \$4 million, with other gifts in process.

Ed's portion of the campaign ends this month. We still have some ways to go to fully fund the Cathedral Project, which includes the Cathedral Center, the courtyard, and the remaining seismic upgrade of the school. While our initial goal was \$8 million, in fact, the project will probably cost in the neighborhood of \$12 to \$15 million. It is not that our plans have changed, but our planning has indicated the true cost of the project. Since this cost will only increase with time, we need to work hard to keep on track.

To achieve our financial and building goals, we have hired Tom Wilson and the Campbell Company in Portland to move our campaign to the next level. The Campbell Company has extensive experience working with religious and faith-based organizations throughout Oregon and the Pacific Northwest. It is important for our campaign to move beyond Portland, working with the Archdiocese of Portland and Archbishop Sample, to inform Catholics and other people of the importance of our project. The Cathedral is an iconic symbol of the Catholic faith in our state, and we want to make our presence known. Tom Wilson understands the importance of our Cathedral, and he is now laying the groundwork for the next phase of our campaign. This may involve a staff person dedicated solely to the short and long term philanthropic fundraising needs of our parish, our school, and our Cathedral. The Administrative Council will review this proposal and make a recommendation to me.

In the meanwhile, we have had a number of important meetings with our architects, Hacker; our landscape architects, Place Studio; our builder, R&H; and our owner's rep, SOJ. Together, we have met with the city for the pre-application review of our design; the Northwest District Association for their first review of our project; and the Archdiocesan Building Commission. Next week we have our second meeting with the Archdiocesan Building Commission, followed by a public meeting with the city Historic Landmarks Commission on April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

All things considered, we are moving along nicely with our project. We keep in mind that our campaign and building plans are a bold vision for the future of the Cathedral and a stronger Catholic identity in Portland and in Oregon. We must be diligent through this process, neither growing slack nor impatient. In closing, I want to again express my gratitude to Ed Lemma for his work with us and putting us squarely on the path to success. A thanks to all, and please keep the Cathedral Project in your prayers.


