A Word from the Pastor

So, what is Christmas all about? Linus knows, and many others do as well, including Charles Dickens. Recently, I reread his great classic, *A Christmas Carol*. The story is about Christmas, but it is also about *conversion*. Christmas invites us not only to celebrate the birth of Jesus, but also to imitate his life. One man, Scrooge, would learn this lesson the hard way.

Scrooge. The very name says it all: tight-fisted, miserly, a curmudgeon whose response to everything is "Bah! Humbug!" But Scrooge is no match for grace, which shows up on Christmas Eve in the form of four ghosts. The first of these ghosts is his old partner, Jacob Marley. Marley arrives dragging chains, and he warns Scrooge that he, too, will carry into eternity the chains he forged in life. But Marley also reminds Scrooge that he has time to change: "I am here tonight to warn you, that you have yet a chance and hope of escaping my fate." Marley tells Scrooge that he will be visited by three spirits: the Ghost of Christmas Past, the Ghost of Christmas Present, and the Ghost of Christmas Yet to Come.

The first ghost takes Scrooge back to his childhood and young adulthood and shows him, painfully, how he changed from a happy lad to a greedy miser—choosing gain over love. The second ghost shows Scrooge the present; in particular, the hard life of his clerk, Bob Cratchit, and his family. It is here that we meet Tiny Tim, the lame, youngest son of the Cratchit family. Though the family is desperately poor, they are happy something unfathomable to Scrooge. At the same time, Scrooge begins to see the sufferings of the poor, and he must confront his own hard attitude. In seeing the Cratchit family, Scrooge's heart begins to change.

The third ghost—the Ghost of Christmas Yet to Come—takes Scrooge to a churchyard, where he sees his own grave. Passersby comment that "no tear was shed" at his passing. He also learns that Tiny Tim is dead. Shocked and saddened, Scrooge's heart begins to melt, and he cries out, "Spirit! Hear me. I am not the man I was! I will honor Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year!" With that, the ghost disappears, and Scrooge wakes up. It is Christmas day.

The story concludes with the "new Scrooge," a transformed man. Where he was miserly before, now he is magnanimous. Where he was irascible before, now he is filled with joy. Where he was a penny-pincher before, now he is indulgent. And where he didn't care a wit about his life or anyone else's before, now he is filled with compassion. Grace, and the spirit of Christmas, worked on Scrooge. And it can work on us as well.

Christ was born into the world over 2000 years ago. He is born again into the world when we show the same love he did. Like Scrooge, all of us are given a second chance, and it begins today. So, what is Christmas all about? "Today, in the city of Portland, a Savior is born to us, who is Christ the Lord."

Mass Obligations on Christmas and the Solemnity of <u>Mary, the Mother of God</u>: This year, Christmas Eve is on a Sunday, and Christmas is on a Monday. This means that we will celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent on Sunday morning, December 24th; and that afternoon, we will celebrate Christmas. Inevitably, the question arises: if we attend Mass on Sunday afternoon, will we fulfill both the Sunday Mass obligation and the Christmas obligation (a two-for-one Mass)? While canonists and liturgists argue the question, the prevailing view is this: each obligation must be fulfilled with a separate Mass (no twofer).

The situation is a little different the following Sunday (December 31st), the Feast of the Holy Family, and Monday (January 1st), the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Because the Solemnity (January 1st, New Year's Day) falls on a Monday, it is not a day of obligation. Therefore, the evening Mass of Sunday, December 31st, will be the Feast of the Holy Family, not the vigil Mass for Mary, the Mother of God.
