A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

I just visited the school and saw the beautiful new gym floor. This work follows upon the seismic upgrade of the gym and the cafeteria. These improvements are the first result of our Cathedral Project and our capital campaign, costing in the neighborhood of \$1 million. We were able to complete this project because of the pledges that had come in by mid-summer. The work was done by R&H Construction, and they finished on time and under budget.

I bring this up because I was somewhat surprised when a parishioner asked me how the Cathedral School will benefit from the Cathedral Project. I said that the school has already benefitted, and they looked at me a little puzzled. They had not known that the seismic upgrade, et. al., was paid for by our fundraising efforts. The question I might expect is “how will the *parish* benefit from the Cathedral Project?” But for those school families who are not parishioners and are considering a pledge, it does make sense to ask how the school will benefit.

The Capital Campaign Committee addressed this issue at a meeting last fall. As you know, the renovation of Cathedral Center (which includes the archbishop’s former residence) will transform the building into a diverse, multi-use facility. This will benefit both the parish and the school with rooms for meetings, classes, informal gatherings, and a large space for dinners, musical performances, and other events.

I envision the entrance to the Cathedral Center on 17th Street opening into a space I call a “commons” or a “welcome center” where groups can gather during the day, whether parents dropping off kids or picking them up, or whether pilgrims arriving for a tour of the cathedral. This commons would be like a college commons, with tables, comfortable chairs, and light refreshments. As I see it, this could be a nice space for the Parents Association to meet (I’m trying to get as much square footage for the commons as I can).

The building will also contain a couple of classrooms and meeting rooms. A “board room” would be perfect for the School Advisory Committee, and the other rooms could be used for CYO meetings, Girl and Boy Scouts, and additional meeting space for the faculty and staff. This is “parish property”; that is, property for all parish functions, including school functions. Cathedral School is an integral part of our parish mission, and I want the school and its needs to be seen as a priority in our planning.

The renovated Cathedral Center will also have a choir room, which could be used by the school for musical practices. And best of all, the new Center will have a Parish Hall that can accommodate 220 for a sit-down meal, or many more for a school reception. Add to this a new cathedral courtyard and a small plaza uniting the entrance of the school and the entrance of Cathedral Center and you get a beautiful parish campus that all of us will enjoy. Will the Cathedral Project benefit Cathedral School? The answer is a definite yes.

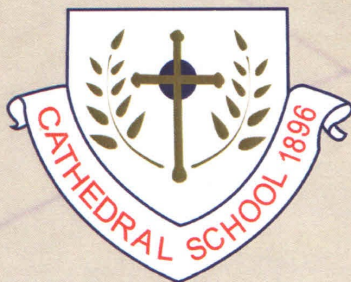

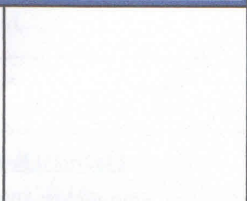

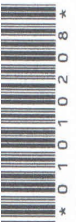
