A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

This Tuesday we celebrate the Fourth of July, our Independence Day. The day commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of Independence 241 years ago on July 4, 1776. The Continental Congress declared that the thirteen American colonies would forever be known as a new nation, the United States of America—no longer part of the British Empire. The Declaration of Independence gives the rationale for this decision, the principal author of which was Thomas Jefferson. The first celebration of the 4th of July took place a year later in Philadelphia, much like our celebrations today. John Adams, the second president of the United States, wrote to his wife that the 4th of July “ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty.

In this regard, one of the events that helped shape the ethos and the culture of the future United States was Puritan John Winthrop’s 1630 sermon entitled “A Model of Christian Charity.” While still aboard the ship *Arbella*, crossing the Atlantic, Winthrop told the Massachusetts Bay colonists that their new community would be “as a city upon a hill,” watched by the world. The city in question was hilly Boston, and to be a “shining light” was the ideal hoped for by the colonists.

Winthrop went on to say that the Puritan’s community in New England would set an example of communal charity, affection, and unity to the world. Or, if the Puritans failed to uphold the covenant of God, “we shall be made a story and a by-word through the world” of God’s judgment.

Winthrop’s sermon gave rise to the widespread belief in American folklore that the United States is “God’s chosen country,” a shining “city on a hill,” that was to lead other nations in the path of God’s truth. Push this a little farther, and you get something called “American exceptionalism”—which can mean superiority, but is better understood as a blessed and rich nation that has much to share with the world.

Needless to say, work remains for this country to be either “a city on a hill,” or to be “exceptional” in any way. Nonetheless, on this 4th of July, we give thanks 1) for the “life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness” that is ours, 2) for the many men and women that have made our country great, and 3) for the exceptional generosity of our country to the world of nations—celebrated in the words of Emma Lazarus:

Give me your tired, your poor,
your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
the wretched refuse of your teeming shore.
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me,
I lift my lamp beside the golden door.
