A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Oregon was the first state in the union to permit the use of "physician assisted suicide." In 1993, a political action committee called "Oregon Right to Die" was founded. Its purpose was to write and pass the Oregon Death with Dignity Act. The following year, 1994, the Oregon Right to Die PAC campaigned successfully for the passage of Measure 16. By a very slim margin (51%), Oregon voters approved the Death with Dignity ballot initiative allowing those who are terminally ill to kill themselves in consultation with their physician and within the guidelines of the law. The passage of Measure 16 made Oregon the first state to legalize physician assisted suicide. Obviously, this was strongly opposed by the Catholic Church.

The Oregon Public Health Division is required by the Oregon Death with Dignity Act (DWDA) to collect information regarding the use of the Act and to issue an annual report. In 2016, 204 people received prescriptions under the DWDA. As of January, 2017, 133 people had died in 2016 from taking prescribed medications. Characteristics of DWDA patients were similar to previous years: most patients were aged 65 years or older (80.5%) and had cancer (78.9%).

A recent study of the Oregon Death with Dignity Act shows a 12 percent yearly increase in lethal prescriptions from 1998 to 2013, with an unexplained jump of nearly 30% in 2015. The report also shows that 25% of those dying people said they were suffering too much pain. Lead author of the study, OHSU Dr. Charles Blanke, said this is a tragedy since it indicates these patients were not receiving help managing their pain.

This coming week is the anniversary of the death of Cicely Saunders (July 14, 2005), a pioneer and founder of the modern hospice movement. Many of you have probably experienced the benefits of hospice. Both of my parents were assisted by hospice in their dying days. When my family met with hospice, we found their counsel regarding the needs of the dying, as well as the needs of the survivors, extremely helpful. Hospice takes a holistic view of dying, taking into consideration the physical, emotional, religious, and social needs of the dying person. In particular, palliative care for the dying means effective pain management. Hospice makes sure that all dying patients have the pain medications they need for true comfort and peace.

Cicely Saunders was a remarkable woman. Born in England, a devout Anglican, she founded St. Christopher's Hospice in London in 1967, the first institution of its kind. Her devotion to the dying and palliative care came from her work as a doctor. Working in hospitals, she was dismayed by the common attitude that "nothing more can be done" for the dying—when she believed that "so much more can be done" for the dying. She put her words into action, and the hospice movement was born. Death with dignity? Yes. Through the loving care of family, friends, and hospice.


