

A Word from the Pastor

I am on vacation and will be back in the office on July 25th. In the meanwhile, here are some reflections on today's Gospel, the "sower and the seed."

Matthew tells us that Jesus spoke in parables—stories that contain more than meets the eye. Today's parable is the sower and the seed. We usually focus on the "seed" and "the ground" when we talk about this parable, but let's look first at the sower. We can picture in our minds a man taking a handful of seeds from a sack over his shoulder and spreading seeds in every direction. What's interesting about this sower is that he casts seeds with abandon, on the path, among the rocks, over the thorns, and in the field itself. This is "the prodigal" sower who sows seed generously and abundantly—almost recklessly, without any concern for the cost or whether the seed will take root.

The sower, of course, is God. The seed represents God's graciousness and love, given to all—and not just a little, but extravagantly. To the good and the bad. Without any expectation of return. "If you love those who love you, what good is that? Do not the pagans do the same?"

That's the sower. So what about the seed? Matthew tells us first that some seed fell upon the path, and birds came and ate it up. This is the person who hears the word but does not understand it. Such an experience is becoming more and more common in our secularized society. The word is preached, but we don't know the language, the concepts, the history, the traditions. That is the seed that falls on the hard path.

Second, the seed falls on rocky ground. This is the person who hears the word, receives it at first with joy, but then falls away because the word does not take root. This is a common experience. For example, we go on retreat, and we are filled with the Spirit. Then we come home, and we experience the usual difficulties in life. Our joy and enthusiasm quickly wane. The word never took root—like the seed on rocky ground.

Third, the seed falls among thorns. This is the person who hears the word, but then is overcome by needless worry or the temptations of this world. These choke the word, and the seed does not bear fruit. In our weakness, we are tempted by many things: power and money and pleasure and fame. All of these choke the word—like seed sown among thorns.

Finally, there is the good soil, where the seed is planted, grows, and produces a hundred-fold. Did you find yourself in this parable? I think all of us can find ourselves in each example: the hard soil, the rocky soil, the thorny soil, and the good soil. May God give us the grace to produce good fruit: hearing the Word, and keeping it.


