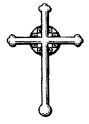

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

I work with a lot of couples preparing for marriage. Some couples look forward to their preparation for marriage, and others show up a bit grudgingly. Some years ago, I was working with a couple that was “half-interested” in marriage prep; that is, the bride was quite enthusiastic, but the groom barely entered into the conversation.

After some time, I became a bit impatient with the groom’s lack of response; so I put a direct question to him: “What do you think marriage is?” He sat sulking in his chair, arms crossed, looking into the distance. His fiancée nervously looked in his direction. I kept my stare on him, even as he turned towards me. What he said nearly floored me. With an economy of words, he said this about marriage: “give yourself, ask for nothing.” The wisdom and truth of that statement has never left me.

We are entering into the wedding season at St. Mary’s Cathedral, and it might be a good time for all couples—many of whom will have anniversaries this summer—to remember the vows they made to each other. In Church law, a *vow* is something different from a *promise*: more serious, more sacred, covenant-like and permanent. The marriage vows contain three important elements: permanence, fidelity, and fruitfulness. At a wedding ceremony, the marriage vows can sometimes flash by so quickly that their meaning is lost. Let’s take a brief look at these three important qualities of marriage.

Marriage is permanent (“all the days of my life”). We live in a world in which virtually nothing is permanent. Things wear out, and we replace them with something new. Marriage says that there is something permanent in our society and culture: a married relationship, a life together, from the wedding day till “all the days of my life.”

Marriage is faithful (“I, John, take you, Jane”). One man and one woman, committed to each other for life. Commitment and trust are two essential factors in a happy marriage. Again, we live in a world that wants the very latest; but marriage says that the “original” couple is just fine. Yes, we get a little older, and our looks change. But marriage is like a fine wine: it gets better with age.

Marriage is fruitful. The standard meaning here is procreation, the blessing of children. But it means more than that in our Catholic theology. It means that marriage is “life-giving,” to a couple, to a family, to the Church, and to society.

I often ask a couple why they want to get married in the Church. Some say because we love each other. Some say “my parents were married in this church” or that “we like the windows.” None of those answers is sufficient because marriage is not about us. It is about God and the call that God gives us. A vocation: a sign of Christ’s love for his Church, made present in the love of husband and wife.
