#### A Word from the Pastor

Two recent high-profile suicides—Kate Spade and Anthony Bourdain—once again highlight the tragedy that, sadly, is becoming more and more common in our American society. While treatment for depression, anxiety, and bi-polar disorder have become more available and even effective, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently reported that the national suicide rate is up 25% since 1999. Suicide is now the 10<sup>th</sup> leading cause of death in the United States. surprisingly, the rise in suicide rates has coincided with an increasing number of Americans being diagnosed with depression and anxiety. The number of people with an openended prescription for antidepressants is at an historic high. Perhaps the number of people dying of an opioid overdose is related to this. The CDC reported that opioids are the third most common drugs found in the systems of suicides, after alcohol and anti-anxiety medications like Xanax.

At the same time, the CDC reports that more than half of the people who died of suicide did not have a known diagnosed mental health condition. The *New York Times* quoted a psychologist, Dr. Matthew Nock, that the majority of people who die by suicide "explicitly deny suicidal thoughts or intentions in their last communications before dying." This seems to be true for both Kate Spade and Anthony Bourdain. One doctor suggested that suicide is simply becoming more acceptable in our society, that young people in particular believe they have a right to die in particular circumstances.

One preventive measure for suicide is unacceptable to many Americans: reduced access to guns. The CDC reported that firearms "were the most common method of suicide used by those without a known diagnosed mental health condition." Suicide rates are highest in states like Montana and Oklahoma where gun ownership is more common. But many factors contribute to the increased number of suicides in the United States. The CDC recommends a comprehensive public health approach to suicide prevention. This involves coordination and cooperation of every institution in our society, especially our inadequate mental health systems. Working together, something can be done.

Part of the fallout of suicide, or any trauma or tragedy, is that people begin to doubt the existence of a loving God. All the great theologians (and, in particular, C. S. Lewis) have wrestled with the coexistence of God and suffering. Yet, even Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Jesus' question, like ours, was not answered in the moment; and I accept the fact that, in these circumstances, our knowledge and understanding are limited. So, what does Christianity have to offer in the face of unbearable pain and sadness? In a word, consolation: that there is a greater purpose beyond our own; that our grief is real; that God does not abandon us; that great suffering will reap an eternal reward; and that a community of believers will walk with us through the dark valley. Indeed, as the dying priest states in Bernanos's novel, "All is grace."
