A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

I've always been interested in the early history of the Catholic Church in Oregon. What got me started was the discovery that the Archdiocese of Portland is the second oldest archdiocese in the United States. How can that be? Weren't their older archdioceses on the east coast? How did Rome know anything about the northwest of the United States in the middle of the 19th century?

With all of those questions in mind, I thought I would do a series of Bulletin columns on the early history of the Catholic Church in Oregon. I have said before that Catholics have played an important role in our state, that among the first settlers of the Willamette Valley were Canadian Catholic fur traders and their families, and that the "Father of Oregon," Dr. John McLoughlin, was a Catholic. But how did it all begin, and how did it develop? That is what I would like to explore.

First, however, let me say something about the native populations of western Oregon. Who was here when the early explorers and settlers arrived? How numerous was the native population? And what word or name do we use to refer to the native peoples?

Archeological evidence dates the earliest human habitation in Oregon to 12,000 to 10,500 BC (some claim it is even earlier). Because tides and weather have covered over traces of human history, it is hard to know how long the Oregon coast has been inhabited. At the time of first contact with Europeans, the Clatsop tribe lived around the mouth of the Columbia. South of Tillamook Head were the Tillamook and the Nehalem Tillamook. Their homeland extended as far south as present-day Lincoln City. Further to the south were the Siletz, Yaquina, and Alsea peoples. The Kalapuya people resided in the foothills of the Cascade Range. The Siuslaw and the Lower Umpqua peoples lived from Heceta Head south to the dunes around present-day Reedsport. At Coos Bay were the Hanis Coos, the Miluk Coos, and Upper Coquille. South of them were the Coastal Rogue and the Chetco. The Chinook and the Kalapuya tribes largely populated the area from Portland into the Willamette Valley.

The conservative pre-contact population of coastal native peoples is about 180,000 in the 1770s. But because of small pox, measles, malaria, and influenza, these populations declined to 35,000 to 40,000 by the 1850s. Tribes on the northwest coast lost an estimated 80% of their populations. The Siletz people alone lost 90% of their population in less than a century.

Finally, what do we call these peoples? What exonym is useful? Indians, Native Americans, American Indians, Indigenous Peoples, First Nation, Aborigines? Tribal names? In fact, no single term is appropriate in all instances, and there is no agreement among scholars. I will move among the various names, according to the context.
