A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Happy Pentecost to everyone! In my Pentecost remarks, I want to express thanks to one gift of the Holy Spirit that has been in operation for over 100 years: Cathedral School. This has been an incredible year for our school, and I congratulate our principal, Mrs. Biggs, and all the faculty and staff who continue to serve us in this important educational mission for our children. Needless to say, such a mission is no easy task, given the complexities of our society. But Cathedral School continues to be a bright academic star in our city, with the additional purpose of forming our young people in Catholic values and social responsibilities. In every way, our school has been successful.

I say this not simply because I am the pastor and, along with the principal, have responsibility for the school. I say it because national test scores indicate that our children are virtually all at or above grade level. In fact, look for the advertisement of Cathedral School on the back cover of the June issue of *The Winged M*. This page is sponsored by the Archdiocese of Portland to highlight Catholic schools, and Cathedral School was selected to be the first example of our Catholic educational success. A special thanks to our great faculty!

We graduate a very fine 8th grade class this year, and we will miss them. I am proud to say that each 8th grader was accepted into the school of his or her choice. It has come back to me from the principals of our area high schools that they look forward to welcoming Cathedral students because of their academic achievement, their mature behavior, their solid faith, and their ability to integrate into the student body. I was particularly impressed with our 8th grade at a recent prayer service in which the 8th grade honored the faculty and staff of the school and the parish as they look ahead to high school. Their poise, sincerity, and well-chosen words struck me deeply and made me proud that our school environment had formed them. We wish them well!

I am a member of the School Advisory Council (SAC), so I keep a close watch on school policies, administrative oversight, budgetary issues, and planning. What an impressive group! Everyone on the council is dedicated to the school and the principal, and all share the common purpose of keeping our standards high. Such standards continue to attract new families and students, and our enrollment continues to grow. There are still places remaining for the 2017-18 school year, so get word out to your friends.

Naturally, there are still things we can do to improve our school, and we don't want to be blind to them. Most importantly, we must keep a positive attitude, eliminate gossip and rumors that undermine our best efforts, and encourage good and strong communication. If we do, Cathedral School will continue to prosper, and our children will be well served. Thank you, Mrs. Biggs, faculty, and staff. Well done!

THE CATHEDRAL PROJECT

- This occasional "box will give an update on the Cathedral Project, that is the planned renovation of Cathedral Center, our courtyard, and the seismic upgrade of our school.
- We have engaged Hacker Architects to design our renovation; we are working with SOJ, a large consulting management company, as project managers.
- The Campaign Committee met on May 10 and May 24;
 Archbishop Sample hosted two campaign receptions in his home, April 25 and May 17.
- A target of \$1 million was set for May; already, \$910,000 (91%) has been pledged by 29 leadership donors.
