A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

The Portland Art Museum is one of Portland's gems. Established in 1892, it is the oldest art museum in the Pacific Northwest. Its current building at the corner of SW Park Avenue and Jefferson Street was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi in 1932; in 1992, the museum acquired the adjacent Masonic Temple, now the Mark Building of the museum. Ambitious plans for the museum are now on the drawing board, and when completed, the two buildings will be connected by a glass pavilion that will feature the work of Mark Rothko (a one-time Portland resident).

A current exhibit at the museum should interest Catholics. It is an altarpiece that has come together for the first time since it was dismantled—a nice way of saying it was sawed apart—in the 19th or early 20th century. The Portland Art Museum owns one panel of this nine-panel masterpiece, donated by the Samuel H. Kress Foundation in 1961 (yes, the "Kress" name is the same as the "Five and Dime" store—now Nike Town). Three panels of the altarpiece are from the North Carolina Museum of Art, along with another three from the Metropolitan Museum of Art. A larger central panel is from the Art Institute of Chicago. One panel is missing.

First all, what is an altarpiece? With our current free-standing altars (an altar you can walk around), it is a little hard to imagine the important place of altarpieces in pre-Vatican II liturgies. When altars were placed against the wall in a sanctuary, an altarpiece—an artwork, such as a painting, a sculpture, or a relief—was usually placed above and behind an altar. It could be a single work, such as a large painting, or it could be an ensemble of pictures or statues on a religious theme. Altarpieces were some of the most important examples of Christian art from the Middle Ages to the Counter-Reformation and beyond.

The artist of the altarpiece is Franciscuccio Ghissi, an Italian artist active in a region called the Marche in the late 14th century. In conjunction with the North Carolina Museum of Art, eight of the extant panels were brought together so that we can appreciate the work as a whole. As I mentioned, one panel is missing. A Dutch conservation artist, Charlotte Caspers, was commissioned to recreate this panel using original materials and techniques. A fascinating video at the exhibit shows Caspers at work, making the original pigments and applying gold leaf. In addition, the curators had to decide what subject to put in the new panel. They chose a story from *The Golden Legend*, a 13th century book of the saints that inspired the other panels. Because a new work of art, with strong colors and bright gold leaf, would not match a 600-year-old altarpiece, a digital copy was made to match the original panels. The match is virtually perfect.

I applaud the Portland Art Museum for sponsoring this project and bringing it to Portland. The exhibit continues through July 9. Don't miss it!
