A Word from the Pastor

Last week (October 31, 2017) was the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. The Reformation is commonly dated to Martin Luther's posting of 95 Theses on the door of All Saints Church in Wittenberg, Germany. The Theses had to do with certain aspects of penance and indulgences; but in the months and years that followed, Luther's critique of Catholicism would encompass papal authority, sacramental theology, monasticism, the cult of the saints, and the relationship of faith and works. Many of the issues which separate Lutherans and Roman Catholics have been settled through the Lutheran-Catholic Dialogue (including the thorny issue of faith and works); but Protestantism has fractured into so many disparate parts that hope for unity is still a long way off.

We live in an age of great tolerance, and this is good. Vatican II stated that "elements of truth" exist in all Christian But this tolerance can also lead to an denominations. indifferentism, that there is no real difference between one denomination and another—and that they equally contain the truth. As Catholics, we believe that the fullness of God's truth and revelation is present in the Catholic Church.

So what distinguishes our Catholic faith from the others? The differences are clearly visible if we compare the interiors of a Catholic church and a Baptist church. When you enter a Catholic church you see a holy water font at the door, the interior is colored by stained glass windows, there are statues and pictures of the saints, there is a tabernacle with a vigil light, a prominent altar and a crucifix with a suffering Christ. Now, enter a typical Baptist Church. It may be a plain room or a large auditorium, no stained glass, no images, no sacramentals of any sort, no crucifix. There may be a small table for an altar with a Bible on it. The sanctuary will have a prominent pulpit for preaching. There may be theater seats with cup holders, stage lights, and a prominent sound system.

These physical characteristics highlight deeper theological differences between Catholics and Protestants. The "Catholic imagination" says that created realities can reflect and image the divine, that God is disclosed in nature, art, and symbol. This view is based on the Incarnation, that God is close to us and that Jesus became one with us. Classical Protestantism would see things differently, that God is more transcendent, distant, and that nature is fallen and corrupt—it cannot image God. Protestant theology stresses Redemption over Incarnation (thus, the question, "Are you saved?"), and grace covers over our sins (while not removing them), allowing for salvation.

"Human nature is damaged by original sin, but the image of God remains," says Fr. Thomas Rausch in his excellent book Being Catholic in a Culture of Choice. "Humanity, in all its concreteness is the bearer of the divine." In short, Catholicism offers a more optimistic view of human nature and the world. "This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it, in Christ Jesus our Lord."


Got Questions About Life? You're Invited! Mondays at
