Scripture Readings for Nov 19

Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20,30-31; 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

A Word from the Pastor

The month of November begins with a commemoration of the saints in heaven and continues with the remembrance of our beloved dead. Naturally, this focus on the "life beyond" calls to mind our own death—and our preparation for it. I thought about this the other day as I helped a friend walk through his *advance directives*. These directives give our families and our health care professionals some idea of the medical procedures we want, or don't want, when we cannot make those decisions ourselves. Advance directives, and a will, are two documents that everyone should have on file. When you think of your family, no one is too young to prepare for the future.

But advance directives can be a little confusing, especially for Catholics who want their directives to be consistent with Catholic moral teaching. This column will highlight some of the things you want to consider. Advance directives can be of two types: living wills and health care agents. It is best to choose a "health care agent" (a person with durable power of attorney for health care) who can make sure that your advance directives are followed. End of life situations can be confusing, and no one can adequately anticipate all the circumstances of one's death. Thus, you want someone on the scene who can evaluate the situation and make a judgment according to the spirit of your directives. For example, you may say that you do not want "life support." But life support may be necessary only to get you to the hospital, with recovery in sight. At that moment, you want life support.

Here are a couple of things to keep in mind as you consider advance directives. Catholic moral teaching distinguishes ordinary means of medical support and extraordinary means. Ordinary care is always obligatory. This includes the "ordinary things" we do to make a patient feel comfortable: easily performed medical procedures, keeping the patient clean and comfortable (with normal medications), and providing nutrition (food) and hydration (water). These last two are not considered medical treatment; rather, whether we are sick or well, we need food and drink—which is ordinary care.

Extraordinary means are those that place a disproportionately great burden on the patient and on those who care for the patient. Extraordinary means often involve severe pain, great expense, and no reasonable hope or benefit to the one for whom they are intended. They often prolong life when death is imminent and there is no chance of recovery. There is no obligation to provide extraordinary means of life support.

As you go through the advance directive document, you should indicate your preferences, but I recommend that you leave many decisions up to your health care agent (having discussed your preferences beforehand). Once you know a few principles from Catholic moral theology, you can make an informed decision about your advance directives. We are stewards of the life God has given us—from birth, until natural death.


