A Word from the Pastor

Last Sunday we had the official rollout of our Cathedral Project and the capital campaign to support it. It wasn't the first time we've spoken of the Cathedral Project, but it was the most complete, allowing questions and answers and discussion. I found the sessions very helpful, and I'm grateful to everyone who took the time after each Mass to attend the socials. A very special thanks to all the helpers who made these socials possible.

So what is my take-away from the questions and comments of those who attended the information sessions? First of all, most people were pleased with the conceptual drawings for the renovated Cathedral Center and the courtyard. People liked the large glass doors that opened onto the courtyard, expanding the capacity of the hall and allowing for an indoor/outdoor event. The very fact that Cathedral would have a sizeable hall just across the courtyard from the church was seen as beneficial for parish events. At present, the parish is not able to accommodate a large event, such as a wedding reception or a funeral luncheon—or any event, for that matter, that is larger than about 60 people (standing). Thus, the hall is perceived as a priority among the components of the Cathedral Project.

Second, there was interest in the possibility of a "welcome center" for the Cathedral. This welcome center, or "commons, as I have called it, would have an entrance on 17th Street, across from the school (or, in another configuration, where one enters the current Cathedral Center). The commons would include a space where visitors or parishioners could gather for coffee, to visit, look at a display (e.g., historical pictures of St. Mary's Cathedral), or perhaps buy a rosary or religious article. Tour groups could gather here for an orientation to the Cathedral, then move into the courtyard and the Cathedral itself.

Third, the courtyard looked plain and empty in the conceptual drawing, and people expressed an interest in having something "green": a tree or two, shrubbery, flowers. I explained that the conceptual drawing of the courtyard was very preliminary and much work has yet to be done. People made a few comments about the fact that the colonnade on the east side of the courtyard would probably have to be moved to make way for the opening into the hall. The hope is that the colonnade would be transferred to the north side, making a small, meditative garden, with our statue of Mary. Regret was expressed that the current Japanese maple is probably not healthy enough to remain a permanent element in the courtyard.

Finally, a word about the adoration chapel: there is a strong desire to maintain this ministry in the parish, and I intend to. We will work out the practical issues.

For now, I would echo the words of Ed Lemma our consultant: pray, study the brochure, and consider a pledge to our capital campaign. Think big! We can do it.


