

A Word from the Pastor

We are always looking for new liturgical ministers, and I encourage you to volunteer. A liturgical minister is someone who assists us at liturgy—the Mass, or other sacraments. These ministers include lectors, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, altar servers, cantors, choir members, musicians, ushers, greeters (hospitality), sacristans, and those who prepare our liturgical environment.

I am old enough to remember a time when the word *ministry* was limited to clerics. This goes back to the Council of Trent (1545-63). In reaction to the Protestant Reformers, who emphasized a ministry of the word and a commonality between clergy and laity, the Catholic Counterreformation defended the *clerical* ministries of minor orders, subdiaconate, diaconate, and priesthood. Everything (except perhaps altar servers, and this was men only) that took place in the sanctuary was done by clerics. This is not to say that there was no "ministry" by lay people. There were many religious orders, of men and women, and various lay organizations, who served the Church in healthcare, education, spiritual direction, missionary work, and care for the poor.

The great watershed for lay ministry is Vatican II. The Council had provided very fertile soil, and good fertilizer, to produce an abundant crop. Two groundbreaking theological principles provided the catalyst that spurred the growth of lay ministry, both in the Church and without. The first is the universal call to holiness. The second is that lay people, because of their baptism and confirmation, share in the priestly, prophetic, and shepherding offices of Christ. Thus, according to their state in life, they have a unique role to play in the mission of the Church. In short, the apostolate of the laity is fundamental to the Church's life and mission.

The universal call to holiness is spelled out in *Lumen Gentium*, where it says that "the forms and tasks of life are many but there is one holiness, which is cultivated by all who are led by God's Spirit" (41). Whether baptized, professed, or ordained, we are all called to holiness and to discipleship. This discipleship leads to ministry. The *Decree on the Apostolate of Lay People* says this: "Lay people, too, sharing in the priestly, prophetical, and kingly office of Christ, play their part in the mission of the whole people of God in the Church and in the world" (2).

I was ordained in 1977 and assigned to St. Therese Parish in NE Portland. It was there that I first witnessed lay readers, Holy Communion in the hand, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, and the wine offered to the congregation. I remember my excitement, and the excitement of the lay people who assumed this ministry, especially the Eucharistic ministers. Some cried as they offered the body and the blood to their families and friends. Now, we need your help at St. Mary's Cathedral. Won't you offer your services for the good of our parish? I can assure you, the blessings you will receive are many—and we will benefit, too.

DESCRIPTION OF LITURGICAL MINISTRIES ST. MARY'S CATHEDRAL

HOSPITALITY

GREETERS welcome people at the doors of the cathedral. Greeters hand out worship aids; ask parishioners to carry up the gifts; and hand out bulletins and copies of *The Catholic Sentinel* at the end of Mass. Training is on the job. Families are welcome to act as greeters.

USHERS seat people as needed; take up the collection of the day; and ensure the security of the congregation during services. Training is on the job. Young people who are at least sixteen years of age may act as ushers.

PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

LECTORS proclaim the Word of God at Mass. Training for new lectors is held at a time which is convenient to them. Experienced lectors meet as needed for prayer and continuing education. Young people who are at least sixteen years of age, and confirmed, may act as lectors.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION distribute Communion at Mass. Ministers of the bread and ministers of the cup are needed. Training for new ministers is held at a time convenient to them. Young people who are at least sixteen years of age, and confirmed, may act as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.
