#### A Word from the Pastor

November is the month in which we remember and pray for our beloved dead. This takes an odd turn on the eve of All Saints, called Halloween in our culture, in which the dead beguile and bedevil us. Yes, we are haunted by death, and we are fascinated with the mysteries beyond the grave. Christianity has clear answers for these mysteries, but we are inevitably drawn to the stories and myths that give us a good scare. Who doesn't enjoy a Halloween movie?

But we move from raucous celebration of Halloween to the quiet feast of All Saints on November 1<sup>st</sup>. Here we remember the saints in glory—those triumphant individuals who have "washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the lamb." It's just a jump, then, to All Souls on November 2<sup>nd</sup>, when we remember those dead whose journey to God is not yet complete. Perhaps in our minds we blend these two feasts together, but each is unique, with its own theology and tradition. Together, they offer a consoling vision of Christian death.

The Church's liturgies for All Saints and All Souls help us understand how the two feasts are related—but also distinct. The best place to start is to look at the "Prayer over the Offerings" for both feasts. The prayer for All Saints says this:

> May these offerings we bring in honor of all the Saints be pleasing to you, O Lord, and grant that, just as we believe the Saints to be already assured of immortality, so we may experience their concern for our salvation.

This prayer tells us that we should not worry about the saints we remember at this Mass because they are already fully united with God. Rather, our prayer is for us, that "we may experience their concern for our salvation." These saints intercede for us, continuously, before the throne of God. In contrast, the prayer on All Souls says this:

> Look favorably on our offerings, O Lord, so that your departed servants may be taken up into glory with your Son, in whose great mystery of love we are all united.

The prayer of Nov.  $1^{st}$  expresses the Saints' loving concern for us; the prayer of Nov.  $2^{nd}$  expresses the desire that God receive our loved ones into that "great mystery of love (in whom) we are all united." We pray for our loved ones in the hope that, one day, they will also pray for us.

During the month of November we will remember in a special way, and pray for, all of those who died in the past year and were buried from our parish. Please join us for a special remembrance on November  $5^{\text{th}}$ , when our choir will sing a *Requiem* by Andrew Wright at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. And may all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

Composed in a style similar to the Requiems of Gabriel Fauré (1845-1924) and Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986), this modern setting, written in 2000, captures the beauty and peaceful nature of the text.

The Book of Remembrance: November is the month in which we, in a special way, remember those who have died and gone before us. We are invited and encouraged to write the names of the deceased for whom we would like the parish to pray, in the book just outside the

Eucharistic Chapel. Also placed in the book will be the names written on the All Souls Day offertory envelopes.
