A Word from the Pastor

I remember 2002 when the *Boston Globe* broke the story of (former priest) John Geoghan. I was working in a seminary at the time, and the news spread like wild fire. The *Globe* reported that, by the mid 1990s, more than 130 people had come forward accusing Geoghan of sexual abuse. What made the story worse is that Cardinal Bernard Law had known of the abuse since 1984, yet he continued to reassign Geoghan from one parish to another.

This was not my first encounter with sexual abuse in the Church. The Archdiocese of Portland had its own notorious case in 1983: Thomas Laughlin. Laughlin was convicted of abusing two boys at All Saints Parish. In fact, the abuse was much more extensive than that. I should know, since I prepared the case of his laicization ("defrocking") for Rome. The Laughlin case would open the floodgates of clerical abuse in the archdiocese. At the time, parishes were warned that settlements with victims could lead to the confiscation of parish funds and property. When a \$125 million case in punitive damages was brought to the court in 2004, the archdiocese declared bankruptcy.

My friends, some of whom are Catholic and some not, have asked me how I can be a part of a Church that has been the source of so much crime and suffering because of clerical sexual abuse. I know that many people have left the Church, to one degree or another, because of the scandals that have taken place over the last 30 years or more. And though we have been shocked before, the recent Pennsylvania grand jury report seems to have hit a new level of depravity: over 300 priests and 1,000 victims of abuse. Even long-time, devout, and faithful Catholics have begun to question the rock-solid foundation of the Church and its mission in the world. Is there anything left? Is there any reason to stay?

Well, yes. We are clearly facing the greatest challenge to the Church in modern history. This is surely the low point in American Catholic history. The worst part is the suffering of so many victims, caused by sick, sinful, and criminal priests—aided by complicit bishops—who have ruined so many lives. Still, I cast my lot with the Catholic Church.

And here's why: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." This may seem like a cliché, or a wornout and overused quotation, but this scripture passage is the only thing that comes to my mind whenever I feel frustrated by the Church. And where would I go? Join the Episcopalians? Maybe the Lutherans, or Methodists? The Orthodox at least have sacraments. No. This is my home. This is my family.

And that is the bottom line. I can no more leave the Catholic Church than I could leave my own family. I was born into this family, with all of its quirks, its sins, and its odd uncles and weird aunts. But our family also has many good people, many saintly people, many heroes. They inspire me, and give me confidence: their good will prevail.
