A Word from the Pastor

With this Labor Day weekend we unofficially bring to a close the summer season. I hope all of you had a good summer, with some time off from work to enjoy this beautiful time of year. I love summer! And I love it mostly because of the warm weather, though this summer was a bit extreme. Still, as I recall, the winter was a bit extreme, too—so a good balance is struck.

With the beginning of the Catholic school year, our parish school, Cathedral School, is ready to welcome back its faculty, staff, and students. Whether you are new to Cathedral School, or whether your family has been with us for generations, one thing remains the same: you will not find a better education, Catholic formation, and value driven school than Cathedral. We are proud of our long history, our successful graduates, and the strong commitment of parents, faculty, and staff to make Cathedral School a model of primary education in the city. Add to this an outstanding School Advisory Council, and you have the ingredients that spell success. If I sound like a proud "father," I am. And with good reason.

Each year the school selects a symbolic theme that might capture, in part, the essence of the school year ahead. This year the theme is "Celebrate Family." Since parents are the first and foremost teachers of their children, it seems appropriate that Cathedral School should recognize this. As such, Cathedral School will cooperate with parents in their important educational role, even as parents will cooperate with the school in its important role. Together, parents and school will serve the best interests of our children, all the way from pre-kindergarten to eighth grade. An important component in the educational experience of our children is their personal safety. With that in mind, we completed this summer "part one" of a seismic upgrade of the school. The current upgrade included the gym, the cafeteria, and the associated hallways. RH Construction did an outstanding job in completing the project on time, and I am grateful to our parishioners Walt Bianchini and Marcus Parker for their supervision of the project. By the way, the seismic upgrade is Phase I of our Cathedral Project. The pledges thus far received in the capital campaign enabled us to move forward with the seismic upgrade. More on this in another column.

Some new faculty and staff will be joining us this year at Cathedral School, and I welcome them to our parish family. I look forward to working with Mrs. Biggs, the faculty, the staff, and the parents as we begin this 2017-2018 academic year. This will be the seventh year for both Mrs. Biggs and myself at Cathedral, and each year brings the parish and the school closer together. It's a winning formula!
