A Word from the Pastor

I am going through pictures I took this summer at Grand Teton National Park and Yellowstone National Park. I took thousands of pictures to get a few good ones; and, fortunately, I did get a few good ones that I will eventually post on my website (monsignorpat.com).

I traveled east after the 7:30 a.m. Assumption Day Mass. The parks are not as far from Oregon as people might think—fortunately for me, since I had only a week to travel. The first day took me to Boise, a growing city I very much enjoy. The air was smoky, making me a little nervous about photography in the parks. I left Boise early the next morning, traveling east on U.S. 26—more scenic than I-84, especially with the Craters of the Moon National Monument. Along the way, one also passes through Arco, the "atomic city" and home to the Idaho National Laboratory. One returns to civilization at Idaho Falls, and from there it is not far to the Idaho-Wyoming border, Jackson Hole, and Grand Teton National Park.

The first time I saw Grant Teton National Park was in 1983 while traveling to Washington, D.C. to study Canon Law. AAA made a TripTic for me (remember those?), asking if there was anything I wanted to see along the way. I said I wanted to see Yellowstone National Park, so my trip was directed toward Jackson Hole and Grand Teton (which turned out to be a little out of the way—"O happy fault"). As it was, Teton became the highlight of my trip, and I promised myself to get back. Since then, I have been to Grand Teton a number of times. For me, it is sacred space and sacred ground. As with mountains in the Bible, Teton is truly a "place of encounter." The beauty of these mountains, and the spirit they elicit from me, make me proud to be Catholic.

Why is that? Because of what we call the "Catholic Imagination," our appreciation for the fact that created things can mirror the beauty and the glory of God. One glimpse of Grand Teton will prove it! For Catholics, there is an analogy between the human and the divine—that God is close to us and can be experienced in nature, art, and symbol. By contrast, classical Protestantism has a dialectical imagination. God is more transcendent than immanent, and created things can in no way reflect the divine. As such, our Catholic theology is grounded in the *Incarnation*, that God became a human person—Emmanuel, "God with us." Classical Protestantism emphasizes Redemption over Incarnation, that God is distant, that human nature is fallen and corrupt, and that creation cannot image the divine. To see the difference, just look at the interior of a Catholic church in comparison with a Baptist church. Beauty is our portal into the transcendent—and our beautiful Cathedral reflects this.

Gerard Manley Hopkins got it right: "The world is charged with the grandeur of God."
