A Word from the Pastor

My column this week is a parish roundup of news. The first is to announce the hiring of a Director of Development for St. Mary's Cathedral. Over the past six weeks or so we have advertised nationally for a development director who can reenergize our capital campaign and assist us in putting the parish (with the school) on a firm financial foundation. I am happy to announce that our search led us to Kristin Romaine of Phoenix, Arizona. Kristin is a native Arizonan and has worked in the field of non-profit development for many years. She is the product of Catholic education, and she is familiar with the Catholic Church and its institutions. Kristin comes to us after working successfully on two large campaigns in Phoenix, at the Jesuit St. Francis Catholic School and Parish (her alma mater) as well as Xavier College Preparatory High School in Phoenix, an all-girls' school run by the BVM sisters. Kristin and her husband have also been involved with Catholic Charities in Phoenix, becoming foster parents for refugee children. Kristin sees fundraising for non-profits as her vocation. She and her husband have a three-year old child, James, and they are looking forward to moving to Portland, where they have extended family. Kristin will start part-time this month and move into full-time work in October. We welcome her to St. Mary's Cathedral!

Last Sunday I welcomed and introduced our new in-residence priest, Fr. Nazario Atukunda. Fr. Nazario is a priest of the Diocese of Kabale in Uganda. He was educated in Uganda and Rome (Canon Law). He came to the Archdiocese of Portland in 2014, and he has had assignments at St. Joseph Parish in Salem and St. Philip Neri Parish in Portland. He now works full-time at the Tribunal of the Archdiocese, and he will live in residence at Cathedral. Please give him a warm welcome!

I have indicated in a previous column that we are transitioning from Hacker Architects to a new architectural firm to renovate Cathedral Center and our courtyard. I am happy to announce that we have hired Emerick Architects, a local firm that has much experience in renovating older buildings, engineering the seismic upgrade, and working with our local landmarks commission. Emerick is a relatively small firm (about 15 employees) in Portland, with husband and wife principals: Brian and Melody Emerick. Our committee was impressed with their interest in our project; their creative engineering in the seismic field; their easy, conversational style; their excellent local work; and their creative ideas for our project. We very much look forward to working with them.

Finally, I want to thank Fr. Rick LeFaivre for being with us this summer. He will soon be returning to Rome to complete his studies, and we wish him well. And speaking of travels, I will be leaving on pilgrimage with OCP to Ireland and Scotland on September 18th. I look forward to returning to my father's homeland, Ireland, and a first visit to Scotland. I return to Portland on Thursday, October 4th. Please pray for safe travels!

St. Mary's Cathedral Office of Social Services 2018 Annual Report

Cathedral's office of Social Services provides assistance to the poor and underserved in our community directly through the Church office and in collaboration and conjunction with partner agencies throughout the Portland Metro area. While our primary focus is to help individuals and families secure and maintain stable housing and proper nutrition, Cathedral also provides utility, transportation, medical, mental health, hygiene, clothing, and educational assistance. Among those served are the elderly living in the neighborhood, returning veterans, women returning to work after experiencing homelessness, individuals fleeing domestic violence, children and families facing domestic uncertainty, and individuals experiencing a medical or mental health crisis. From June 2017 through July 2018, the office distributed **\$30,612.** in the following categories:

Rent: Includes direct payment to landlords and assistance with emergency/temporary housing (motels, hostels, and clean and sober shelters). **\$3,638.**

Food: Support of the Lift Urban Food Pantry and Adopt-a-Building Program, direct purchase of groceries for individuals and families, food cards to Fred Meyer, Trader Joe's, McDonalds, and WinCo, and food purchased, prepared and delivered to community dinners. **\$9,618.**

Utilities: Assistance paying telephone, water, and electric bills. \$718.

Hygiene: Personal products including incontinence supplies, non-prescription medications, dental and grooming products. **\$596.**

Medical/Mental Health: Assistance with insurance co-pays, prescription medications, clinic visits, and mental health counseling. **\$5,203.**

Children/Education: School supplies, backpacks, clothing, outerwear, tuition assistance, books, Christmas giving. **\$2,900.**

Storage: Payment of fees for the homeless and those in transition. \$200.

Transportation: Gas cards, monthly bus passes, individual bus tickets, and transportation assistance for employment or returning home. **\$3,888.**

Clothing: Coats, footwear, undergarments, hats, scarves, gloves, and tee-shirts. **\$2,994.**

Household: Assistance in setting up residence after homelessness. \$407.

Supplies: Office supplies \$450.
