## SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR OCT 1

Ezekiel 18:25-28; Philippians 2:1-11; Matthew 21:28-32

### A Word from the Pastor

In my last column I talked about funeral rites, and I stated that cremation is permitted as long as it is not chosen for reasons which are contrary to Catholic teaching (C.1176§3). Apparently, there was a time when cremation represented, in some way, a denial of the resurrection of the dead. While this may still be the case. I have never encountered it.

Nonetheless, my column raised further questions regarding cremation, so I thought I would say a few more words on Catholic teaching in this column. The questions regarding cremation are timely, since the Vatican recently published an "instruction" regarding the burial of the deceased and the conservation of the ashes in the case of cremation ("Ad Resurgendum cum Christo," or, "To Rise with Christ," August 15, 2016). To be sure, for some Catholics, cremation remains a controversial issue. What might be described as the "new attitude" toward cremation goes back as far as 1963, in an instruction published by the Holy Office that, in summary, says this: 1) it is recommended that the tradition of burial be retained, 2) but cremation is not forbidden, 3) as long as it has not been chosen for reasons contrary to the faith.

In my research on this topic I discovered that "cremation" is often associated by Catholics with Freemasonry (or Masons). Freemasonry is a fraternal organization that historically was hostile to organized religions (especially Catholicism). For this reason, until very recently, Catholics were prohibited from joining the Masons (though Masons are no longer specifically mentioned in the Code of Canon Law, other Church documents continue to forbid membership in Masonic lodges). Some traditional Catholics claim that cremation, while "not forbidden," is still not explicitly *permitted*. One can argue in this way, but it should be noted that the *Order of Christian Funerals* gives permission for a Funeral Liturgy "celebrated in the presence of the cremated remains."

Speaking about the new instruction, Cardinal Gerhard Müller, Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, said that "caring for the bodies of the deceased, the Church confirms its faith in the resurrection and separates itself from attitudes and rites that see in death the definitive obliteration of the person, a stage in the process of reincarnation, or the fusion of one's soul with the universe."

While the Code of Canon Law recognized the possibility of cremation, Church law had not specified exactly what to do with the ashes (sometimes called "cremains")—thus the occasion of the new instruction. Cardinal Müller stated that "shortly, in many countries, cremation will be considered the ordinary way" to deal with the dead, including Catholics. As for the ashes, they are to be placed in a tomb or columbarium that is marked with a person's name, allowing family and friends to pay their respects and to preserve the memory of the deceased person. We all have a right to pray at the tombs of those we love—stressing our belief in the Communion of Saints and expressing our devotion to those who have gone before us "marked with the sign of faith."
