REMINDER OF MASS INTENTIONS:

In recent years we have been reminded that, while every time Eucharist is celebrated, all of the dead are remembered, the Code of Canon Law, and the Decree of the Diocese of Cleveland, specifies that *"Separate Masses are to be applied for the intentions for which an individual offering, even if small, has been made."* This means that no more than <u>one Intention may be scheduled for any single Mass.</u>

All parishioners are free to schedule Mass Intentions for their deceased loved ones at any time, by filling out the <u>blue ½-sheet form</u>, located at each of the doors of the church. Enclose the form with your <u>stipend of \$10.00 per Mass</u> (make checks payable to OLV), and mail it to the office, or place it in the collection basket. Or you can stop by the office to schedule them personally with Jean. Note that if you are unable to provide a stipend, a Mass Intention will still be accepted.

In addition to Mass Intentions, you may continue to make contributions to OLV's Replacement Account, or other "memorializing" contributions to the parish. Additional Mass Intentions may also be brought to the Parish Office for us to forward to the Cleveland Diocesan Mission Office for distribution to local and missionary priests, who may be in need of intentions, and they will celebrate the Mass for you.
