

**CHAPTER 33: Made for Mission** — Why are you here? On earth? In South Plainfield? At Sacred Heart? In your family? Are you an accident or here just by chance? *Kelly reminds us that "you were made for mission."* "Key point: You cannot be happy focused on yourself. You were made for mission. It's

deep within you. Only by serving others in a meaningful way do we truly discover the happiness we yearn for so unrelentingly.

Action step: What mission do you think God is calling you to now in your life? Just write down his invitation to you today as you can best discern it."



**CHAPTER 34:** When God Looks at a Resume — The only thing God asks of you is your availability. "Key Point: Make yourself 100% available to God and incredible things will happen. Action Step: Pray this Prayer of Transformation every day for nine days."

**Prayer of Transformation:** "Loving Father, I come to you today to make myself 100% available to you. I lay everything I have and everything I am at your feet. Take what you want to take, and give what you want to give. Command me in all things. I will do whatever you ask me to do. Transform me and transform my life, so that I may become the-very-best-version-of myself and lead others to you with my life and my love! Amen."

**CHAPTER 35: Don't Let the Critics Win** — Kelly tells us "Be watchful. Be on guard against the critics. Resistance will use them to discourage you, or at the very least distract you. Press on with what matters most. Perseverance is the antidote for the resistance put forth by critics. It is a great virtue."..."When you are discouraged or caught-up in procrastination, simply do the tiniest thing to move whatever you are working on forward."

**CHAPTER 36: Blessed and Grateful** — Kelly reminds us "Gratitude should always be our first response for all the blessings in our lives. Our second response should be to live a life worthy of the blessings we have received...Gratitude keeps us young. It anchors us to the present moment. It reminds us of what matters most and what matters least, and fills us with the resolve to carry on the great mission God has entrusted to us."

CHAPTER 37: Never Get Discouraged — In this last chapter Kelly summarizes his purpose in writing *Resisting Happiness*. He says "I set out with a simple goal for this book: to give resistance a name and help you to recognize it during the moments of the day. All great stories have a villain and a hero. Resistance is the villain and you are the hero. Simply naming resistance causes it to lose much of its power over us. Sometimes that is all you have to do, because once you name resistance in a certain situation, you recognize it for what it is, and act to break through it. Resistance hates action....When you do break through resistance, celebrate that, and then press on to live the life God imagined for you before the beginning of time.. And if you ever feel discouraged or defeated, remember this: Every moment is a chance to start anew, a chance to turn it all around."

#### PAPAL QUOTE AND CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

**THEME 6: Care for God's Creation:** We show our respect for the Creator by our *stewardship of creation.* We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

"Many of those who possess more resources and economic or political power seem mostly to be concerned with masking the problems or concealing their symptoms, simply making efforts to reduce some of the negative impacts of climate change. However, many of these symptoms indicate that such effects will continue to worsen if we continue with current models of production and consumption. There is an urgent need to develop policies so that, in the next few years, the emission of carbon dioxide and other highly polluting gases can be drastically reduced, for example, substituting for fossil fuels and developing sources of renewable energy. Worldwide there is minimal access to clean and renewable energy. There is still a need to develop adequate storage technologies. Some countries have made considerable progress, although it is far from constituting a significant proportion. Investments have also been made in means of production and transportation which consume less energy and require fewer raw materials, as well as in methods of construction and renovating buildings which improve their energy efficiency. # Blessing of Easter Food

Those with Eastern European backgrounds — Poland, Russia, Serbia, Slovenia, Hungary, Ukraine, the Balkans and other countries with Slavic tradition — might be familiar with the blessing of Easter foods. The food baskets are brought to Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches on Holy Saturday, at noontime. The foods in these baskets are rich in Easter symbolism and serve to do more than whet one's appetite after the long season of Lenten fasting.

**EGGS:** Of course there are eggs — a traditional symbol of resurrection and new life, which some Eastern Catholic and Orthodox church traditions date back to St. Mary Magdalene. The rest of us are probably familiar with *pysanky* eggs from the Ukraine. These geometrically decorated eggs in bright colors with folk art images serve to remind those who see them of Easter. A Russian fable is credited with the saying that an Easter egg given to another person in




love will never spoil. In Poland, families traditionally gather around the Easter table to share pieces of blessed Easter eggs. Also, prior to the 1960s, eggs were not allowed during Lent, so having them again at Easter was a special joy.

**BUTTER:** Another luxury that was forbidden during Lent was butter. The Easter food basket's butter is often shaped like a lamb — to remind us of the sacrificed Lamb of God. The butter may also be decorated with the Easter banner of white with a red cross or with cloves in the shape of a cross.

**BREAD:** Various breads are used to symbolize Christ, "the bread of life." The breads, varying from regular, fresh-baked loaves to round sweet breads filled with oranges and raisins, fill food baskets. Braided bread is also seen.

**MEAT:** While ham, which is smoked or salted and keeps well cold, is the most popular meat — as it is for most Easter dinner menus, there are other meats for the Easter food baskets. These include lamb — with its Christ connotations — veal and bacon, the later symbolizing God's rich mercy. It is also noted that pork — ham or bacon — is forbidden in the Old Testament, so eating it now symbolizes that all things are made new in Christ.

**SAUSAGE:** While sausage is also a form of meat, it is the links of the sausages that offer the symbolism here. Called *kielbasa* in Polish, their resemblance to a chain or a rope reminds us that Christ "broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave" as is sung at the Easter Vigil.



Topping off the food basket for Easter are **WINE** (for joy), **HORSERADISH** (a reminder of the bitter herbs of Passover), **SALT** (a symbol of hospitality in some countries and a reminder that we are "the salt of the earth") and **CHEESE** (usually farmer's cheese).

There is often also a **CANDLE** — unlit — in the basket to remind us that **Christ is our light.** 

However, our Easter food basket is not yet complete. It is often **adorned with boxwood** — an evergreen bush popular in Eastern Europe — **and dried flowers.** 

Covering the basket is a **CLOTH** that is meant to symbolize the burial cloth that wrapped Jesus' body in the tomb. These cloths are often richly embroidered with symbols of the resurrection and are passed down from one generation to the next.

When Easter food baskets are brought to church — on Holy Saturday at noontime — they may be blessed individually or in a group. The baskets are sprinkled with holy water by the priest or deacon and a prayer of blessing is said.

Then, of course, it's back home to get ready for the big dinner (or brunch) on Easter.

### CHRISM MASS



On Monday, April 10, 2017 Bishop James F. Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the Diocese. At this Mass, the Bishop will bless the Holy Oils which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. Saint Ambrose [340-397] began this custom— which we now call the Chrism Mass—in his Cathedral in Milan. These Holy Oils, which are used to sanctify the Faithful, have been channels of holiness for centuries! The OIL OF CATECHUMENS is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the OIL OF THE SICK is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and SACRED CHRISM is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of confirmandi, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head

of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches. At the Mass, all priests make a **Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service**, recommitting themselves to their Bishop and to their ministry to God and His People; the Bishop and all Priests then ask the people for a pledge of their prayerful support. All are strongly encouraged to join in the ancient, grace-filled **Chrism Mass at the** 

Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi in Metuchen at 7:30 PM. The Diocese of Metuchen will provide a live broadcast of the Chrism Mass Monday, April 10.
