BAPTISM/SPONSORSHIP CLASS - Parents and godparents are required to attend one session before the child's baptism date can be confirmed. Sessions are held on **the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:00PM** in the Parish Center - 3rd floor. (Adults only - please, no infants or children.) Registration is required. Contact Sr. Nadine 908-756-0633 x118 to register for the class or with any questions.

SPONSOR LETTERS - Canon (Church) Law mandates that a Godparent for Baptism and a Sponsor for Confirmation be an active, Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic marriage (an individual married civilly by a judge, mayor, or divorced and remarried without an annulment is not eligible to act as a sponsor) and publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching. Please note that we can only write *Letters of Eligibility* for parishioners who meet these criteria.

AED IN CHURCH - An Automated External Defibrillator

(AED) is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient,

ribrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient, and is able to treat them through defibrillation allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. We have purchased & installed an AED in church to assist in emergency medical situations. The AED is door-mounted next to the St. Joseph statue at the front of the church.





Why Are We Here?

It is important to answer this question. Without answering the question we can become confused in our thinking and our actions. For example, if my purpose is to take care of myself alone, then I am justified being concerned solely with my own well-being. If my purpose is to take care of my family only, then I can do whatever it takes to secure them and meet their needs. If my sole purpose is to serve my country, then I must do whatever it takes to provide for national security and needs, regardless of whatever else is going on in the world.

Being a Catholic Christian helps me answer this question and should guide my life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that the "Life of man is to Know and Love God." It continues that "God draws close to man. He calls man to seek Him, to know Him, to love Him with all his strength."

As Catholics, we believe that Jesus came as an infant babe to share our human journey and redeem us from our sin and separation from God. The Catechism states, "To accomplish this, when the fullness of time had come. God sent his Son as Redeemer and Savior" ... "So that this call should resound throughout the world, Christ sent forth the apostles He had chosen, commissioning them to proclaim the gospel: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age." ... All Christ's faithful are called to hand-on the mission from generation to generation, by professing the faith, by living it in fraternal sharing, and by celebrating it in liturgy and prayer."

So we have a purpose! Is it the one you are fulfilling? How well are you living your life in light of this charge given you by your



God and Savior? Scripture tells us how the first Christians lived; those closest in proximity to Christ and

living directly under the guidance of the apostles. This might be one yardstick against which we can measure our faithfulness. In The Acts of the Apostles, it is written "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need. Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. They ate their meals with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people. And every day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved." Acts 2:42-47. Let us ask ourselves, would these first Christians recognize me as one of them, does my life resemble theirs?


